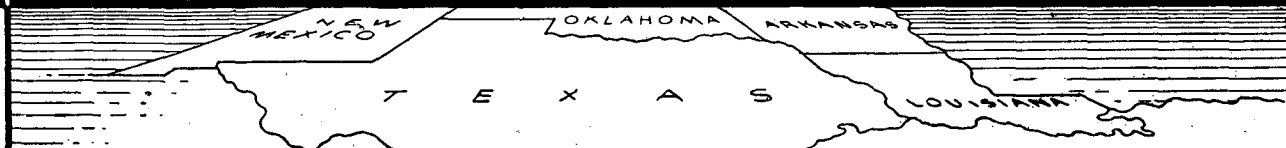

ior College, Keene, Texas.

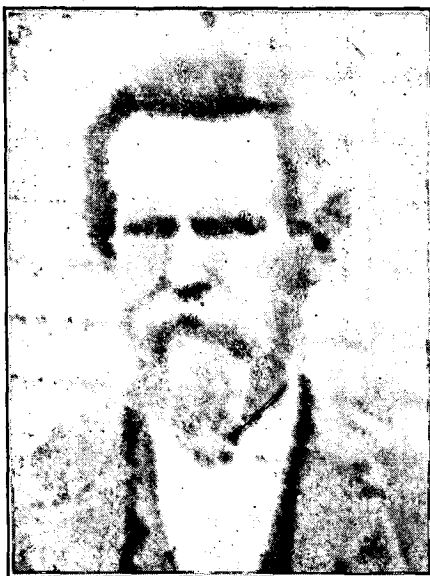
In addition to the list, you will note we have the pictures of the first president and Elder W. S. Greer,

## The Beginning of Southwestern Junior College

IN 1876 the General Conference sent Elder R. M. Kilgore to Texas to preach the truths taught by Seventh-day Adventists. After the seed was sown, results began to spring up, and within a few years small campmeetings were held, where the leaders saw many promising young people among the ranks of the believers.

Several families started a church school at Oak Hill in Hill County, and

Professor and Mrs. H. E. Giddings were the teachers. This was just a beginning.

A few months after a campmeeting held at Garland a deep conviction seemed to rest upon the leaders—that of the necessity of a denominational school. Elder Greer, president of the conference, led in this movement. Using his one-horse, hammock cart he visited among the churches and

companies in Texas, interesting the parents in the need of a Christian education for their children.

After the campmeeting held at South Dallas in 1892 greater consideration was given to this matter by the conference delegates in council with General Conference representatives, and later the following named persons were chosen as a locating committee: Elder W. S. Greer, Brethren B. F.

Wood, H. B. French, T. M. Woodruff, and George Wood. After the counties of Van Zandt, Kaufman, Hood, and Johnson were considered, it was decided to locate the school in Johnson County and Brethren L. B. Wallen and J. C. Mosley, who lived in this county, were added to the committee. A tract of eight hundred acres of cross-timbered land was purchased, B. F. Wood financing the proposition.

In 1893 a recommendation for the opening of the school was received from the General Conference. Then this land was surveyed, a suitable portion set aside for school purposes, and the remainder measured off into plots containing from one and one-fourth acres to ten acres or more to be sold to people who wished to move here for school advantages. Brother L. B. Wallen moved his family to the new location, where they lived in tents,

boarding the men who did the surveying of the land. Brother J. C. Mosley was the first to receive his plot of land.

The growth of the new school was encouraging. Within a few months after it became known that a school was to be established families from the Oak Hill school and other parts of Texas were settled in the town or on near-by farms. It meant much sacrifice for these families to move to this wild, uncultivated country, and after buying their land and building their houses, they had very little money left, but many of them had wagons and teams and made their living by cutting wood and hauling it to Cleburne to be sold. They had willing hearts which meant much in those days, for they helped one another, and donated their time and labor in erecting the school building.

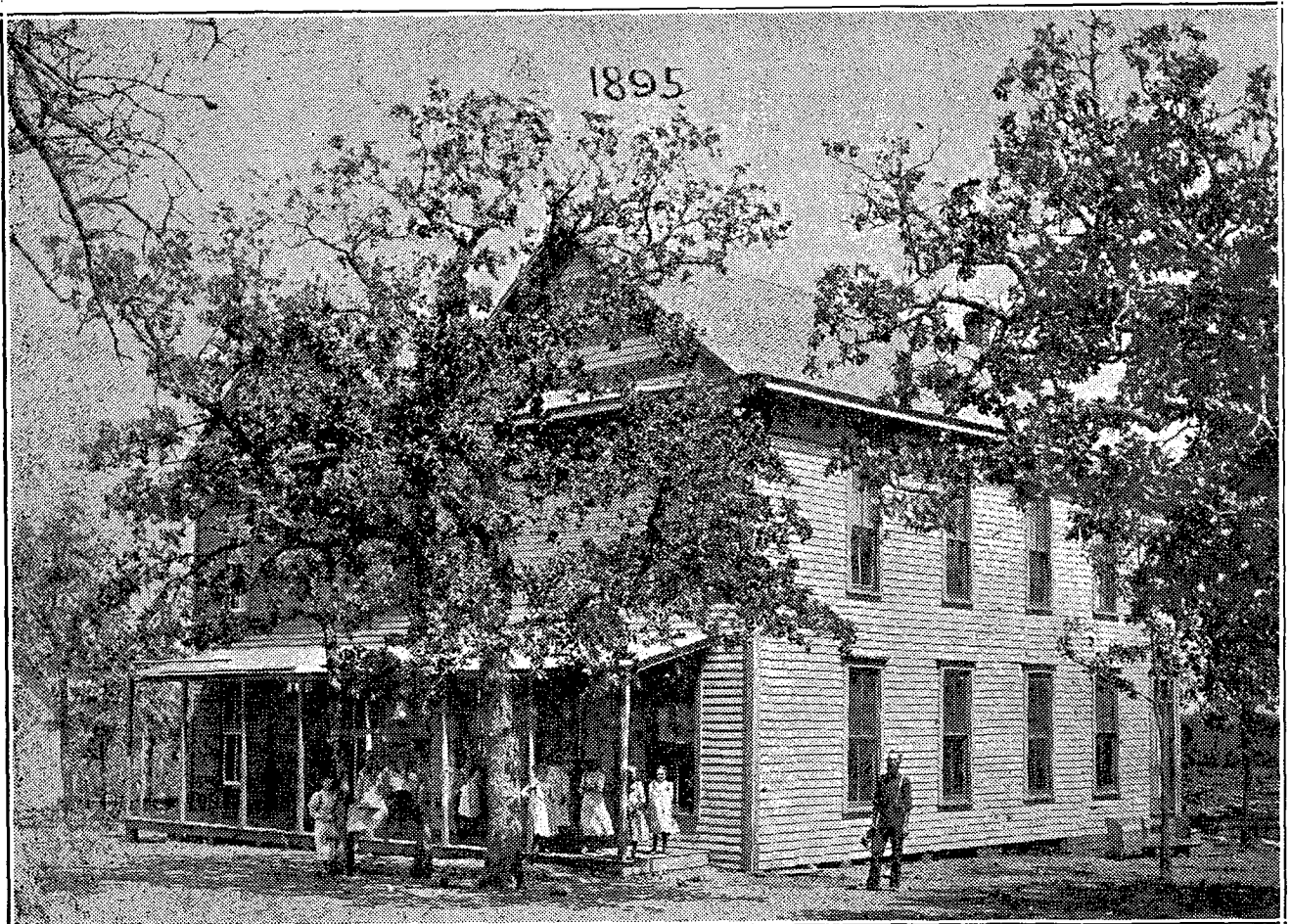
This first school building was just one-half of the right-hand side of the building shown in the picture. The

first term opened January 7, 1894. Soon after the beginning of the 1894-1895 term the attendance had so increased that it was necessary to enlarge the building. Carpenters worked early and late. Then school was dismissed for three days. When they came back they found the capacity of the building doubled, the chapel and recitation rooms on the second floor and all the lower portion made into one room to be used as the assembly hall for the church. This was the building shown in the picture.

For several years many young men were employed to clear land for the school farm, some of them living in tents and boarding themselves. Not only were they paying their school expenses, but they were getting the land ready for cultivation, supplying the school with fuel, and cutting a large quantity of wood which was sold.

In the latter part of the school term of 1894-1895 the property was trans-

ferred to the General Conference in order that it might become a training school for the entire Southwest for already students not only from Texas but from Oklahoma, Indian Territory, and Arkansas were in attendance, and others were anxious to come. Many left good public schools, but were willing to endure hardships and inconveniences that they might have the opportunity of receiving a training that would prepare them for useful workers in the cause of God.

As we review the beginning of this institution we are impressed with the courage and fortitude of its founders who did without many of the necessities of life, but when we see the long list of graduates, we have proof that the supreme object of this school is being realized, for among these graduates are found ministers, Bible workers, doctors, missionaries, stenographers, and a large number of Christian men and women who are living up to the principles of this message in their homes and among their neighbors. We are thankful for such institutions among us.

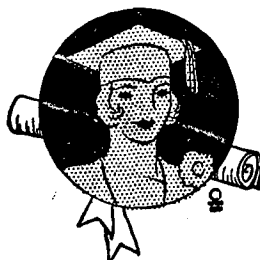
