THE SANITARIUM.

A few days after the camp-meeting equipment had been cleared from the camp-ground, a surveyor staked out the location of the new building, and plows and scrapers soon followed excavating for the basement. That work is now done; the trenches were finished last week, and Wednesday, the 23rd, if nothing unexpected prevents, the cement foundations will be started upon which solid walls will soon be reared to enclose the new main building of the Iowa Sanitarium. A steady procession of teams is hauling the material onto the grounds. Ten carloads of sand and two carloads of gravel from Des Moines, a carload of cement from Mason City, 6 carloads of lumber from the South, and several hundred thousand brick and hollow clay building blocks are on the move toward the Sanitarium grounds to form a part of the institution which, under the blessing of God, is to prove a Bethel to many a sin-sick soul; a place where hundreds of consecrated young people will learn how to minister to the needs of suffering humanity, and who later will utilize this knowledge in far distant fields.

The material thus far ordered, which comprises the most of the material for enclosing the building, amounts to about \$15,000.00. We desire to establish a record of meeting all bills promptly as they fall due—and a little sooner if possible—that our credit may be the best, and we now call upon our people who have subscribed to the building fund to come to

the front with the money that those in charge may not be embarrassed for lack of funds. If our brethren will make a special effort at this time to send in the funds, it will be much appreciated as most of this fifteen thousand dollars falls due within 30 days.

It may be that some have money which they would be willing to loan the Association at a reasonable rate of interest until money comes in on the pledges.

Let us not put off arranging to pay Sanitarium pledges until sometime in the future, but let us begin at once to plan on making payments on them. This will bring in the means as it is needed.

"Outlines of Mission Fields" mentioned in this paper could very profitably be used by Sabbath school superintendents to increase the interest in missions.

In a recent letter from C. M. Jones, manager of the circulation department of the "Signs of the Times," he says: "I was obliged to go to San Francisco today on business, and just as I was leaving the office a copy of the October number of the Signs of the Times Monthly Special was placed in my hands, just from the press. On the train I read it through from beginning to end, and have become so profoundly impressed with the important matter which it contains that I feel constrained to write you once more and appeal to you to do all you can to give this number a wide circulation. These facts and figures are not taken from Socialistic papers or unreliable sources, but from documents issued or endorsed by the trusts and financiers themselves. Both of the great political parties are making this question one of the leading issues in the campaign. It is a subject in which all are interested, and it is certainly timely. But this article forms only a small part of the journal. "Notes on Current Topics," occupying the first few pages of the magazine, are especially interesting this month. Among other important questions, attention is called to the new scheme being

promulgated by Thomas W. Lawson with which to fight the "System". In the "Outlook Department," or "Watch-Tower," we have an article from Elder Wilcox on "The American Federation of Catholic Societies." Brother Wilcox attended the annual meeting of the Society recently held in Boston, Mass., hence speaks from actual knowledge and observation.

"OUTLINE OF MISSION FIELDS."

Great progress is being made in the mission fields where this truth is being proclaimed. No subject should receive more careful study than that of quickly finishing the work out in these fields, where really the "big end" of our work lies.

Just recently a new edition of "Outlines of Mission Fields" was published, bringing our mission story down to the close of 1907. This booklet gives the facts, interestingly told, going to make up the history of the message in the different fields like China, India, Japan, Africa, the islands of the sea, etc. Why not spend some time during the coming winter in becoming familiar with this mission history? A missionary map of the world ought to be in every church, to use in connection with the studies. A large sized one will be furnished at cost—only \$2.25.
