Year Ending December 31, 1934. The Seventy-second Annual Report

THE membership of the 7,818 churches of the denomination throughout the world, December 31, 1934, was 404,509. This is a gain of 119,216 during the past six years, or 20,358 during 1934. The number added by baptism during 1934 was 35,661, and on profession of faith, 3,148, a total of new members received during the year of 38,809.

This work is now conducted in 325 countries and islands, by 23,753 evangelistic and institutional laborers (an increase of 1,499 during 1934), who are using in their work 539 languages and dialects. The increase in languages since 1926 is 283, or one new language added on an average of every ten days since 1926. The increase in countries and islands in which we began work during 1934 was 80, and in new languages in which work is conducted was 35.

This work is carried on throughout the world by 12 Divisions, comprising 70 union conferences, 144 local conferencees, 318 missions, a total of 544 evangelistic organizations, employing 11,642 evangelistic laborers, with 443 associate institutions, with which are connected 12,111 persons, a total of 23,753 laborers, or one laborer actively employed for every 17 church members.

Denominational Literature

Denominational literature is now produced in 169 languages, in the form of 7,182 books, periodicals, pamphlets, and tracts, containing 529,636 pages, one copy of each costing \$2,087.50. The number of persons employed by the 89 publishing houses in producing this literature is 1,090; and the number of persons employed in its circulation is 3,264. The value of denominational literature sold in 1934 was \$3,416,345.80; since 1863, \$102,779,063.22.

Schools and Sanitariums

The number of primary schools is now 2,130, with 2,896 teachers, and an enrolment of 72,625. There are, in addition, 214 advanced schools employing 2,459 teachers, with an enrolment of 25,117; or a total of 2,344 schools with 5,355 teachers, having an enrolment in all the schools connected with the denomination in all the world of 97,742, or one student for every 4.14 church members.

There are 69 sanitariums, 62 treatment rooms and dispensaries, a total of 131 institutions where the sick are cared for, employing 5,066 physicians and nurses, treating during the year 451,549 persons, and giving charity to the extent of \$393,587.52.

Of the amount indicated above, \$6,242,556.35 was raised in North America, and \$3,650,658.32 in all other fields. This is a per capita of \$41.28 for North America, and \$14.41 for all other fields; an average of \$24.46 for the entire world.

A Resumé

A little more than ninety years ago a small group of men, in the New England States, filled with a belief in a message they believed due to the world, began to proclaim the same by voice and pen. Their facilities were very meager, and it was not until 1852, eight years later, that they were able to purchase a small hand printing press and equipment of their own. Development gradually manifested itself, but for many years their efforts were confined to this country.

In 1863 the General Conference was organized, with six local conferences, comprising 125 churches, with about 3,500 members, and thirty general laborers,—all laboring in one language, and in this country. Success attended their efforts, and gradually the work was enlarged. Eleven years later, in 1874, the first foreign missionary was sent out from this country. Other countries were entered, a membership raised up, and institutions established. Twenty years later, in 1894, missionaries were first sent out to a heathen country, Matabeleland, now Southern Rhodesia, in Africa. The work has constantly spread to other lands, until today this cause is proclaimed in 325 countries and islands.

Extent of Work

Beginning with a membership of 3,500 in 1863, constant growth has been realized, until today there are practically 500,000 connected with the movement throughout the world. At first, work was begun in only one language, and in this country, but gradually as the workers have entered other language areas, additional languages have been employed, until today there are 539 languages and dialects employed, with new languages added at the rate of one every ten days during the past eight years.

Membership Gains

The membership of the 7,818 churches now stands at 404,509, with Sabbath school members registering 491,067. This is a gain of 119,216 in church members during the past six years, the greatest gain ever made in any similar period of our history.


Educational Work

Beginning in 1874 the denomination established a school, where its young men and women could be trained and developed as workers, to go out as missionaries to other lands as calls have come. The number of these schools has greatly increased, and there has been a system of schools established, requiring sixteen years to complete, covering the entire requirement for educational work, not only along literary lines, but in medical as well as in nursing. There are today 2,130 primary schools, with 214 advanced schools, a total of 2,344 schools of all kinds, employing 5,355 teachers, and having an enrollment of 97,742, or one student for every 4.14 church members. During 1934 there was graduated from all the schools throughout the world, 2,392 students, and 1,113 students entered some line of denominational work. So there is every prospect for additional growth in laborers in various departments of this cause.

Lay Workers

Some may have occasion to wonder at the rapid gains made by this cause in various lands. Just an illustration or two that will partly explain the reason.

Three years ago our work entered the island of Mussau, of the St. Matthias Group. These islanders were then absolutely raw heathen, untouched by former mission work.



They were carried the gospel, and a transformation resulted; and today some of these islanders have been taken on as workers, and transferred to other islands of the Pacific, to labor for the natives of those islands. Now consider that these were raw heathen three years ago, and yet transformed in this short space of time as workers for others, carried across seas, there to engage as workers for other people!

Another illustration, again from heathen lands: In Ruanda and Urundi, in Central Africa, about 3,000 native believers, with such training as they receive in church groups, have gone out into companies of ten or twelve, as lay workers, with daily meetings at central points, to arouse large populous sections of those countries.

So when the returns show 23,753 laborers connected with this movement, no account is taken of the many thousands of lay workers engaged in lay efforts in the spread of this cause in many lands and in many languages.

Churches and Institutions

The value of the 3,456 church buildings owned by the denomination is \$10,634,282.41, and the seating capacity is given as 540,518. There are now 443 denominational institutions carrying on work, including 69 publishing houses, 69 sanitariums and hospitals, 62 treatment rooms, 214 schools, and 29 food companies, besides many others which are self-supporting, and which, like the lay workers referred to above, are doing excellent service for the denomination.


Sanitarium Work

The care and treatment of the sick has been an important part of denominational work for many years. Beginning in 1866 they established a sanitarium where the sick could be cared for, and have added to the number, until today there are throughout the world 69 sanitariums and hospitals, 62 treatment rooms, besides many private institutions doing similar work. The assets of these institutions is \$8,459,711.05, with 4,163 nurses and other employees, 903 physicians, treating during the year 1934, 451,549 sick persons, and giving charity to the extent of about \$400,000. All classes of cases are cared for. There are a number of places where lepers are housed and treated. In one place—Malambo Mission, Nyasaland—there are today 242 lepers, each kept in a sanitary brick hut, the interior and roof of which are burned when the patient is discharged or dies. Forty-nine arrested cases have been discharged at that place.

Denominational Literature

On page 3 there is shown, year by year, the value of one copy of each denominational publication, including papers, books, and tracts. Beginning in 1846, an entire set of denominational literature could have been purchased for 93 cents. Nineteen years later, in 1865, the value was \$8.33; twenty years later, in 1885, the value was increased to \$96.60. In 1900 we were publishing literature of all kinds in 39 languages, having a value of \$267.84; in 1930, we had increased to 146 languages, with a value of \$1,814.73. At the close of 1934, we were issuing literature in 169 languages, one copy of each publication costing \$2,087.50. This literature is in the form of 250 periodicals, 1,773 bound books, 1,009 pamphlets, and 4,150 tracts, a total of 7,182 publications, containing 529,636 pages.


