of Seventh-day Adventist Conferences, Missions, and Institutions For the Year Ending December 31, 1942

WORLD conditions during 1942 have made it impossible to secure information of the progress of Seventh-day Adventist work from considerable sections of the world field. Some divisions of the General Conference territory have been cut off entirely, and from other sections only partial summaries have come to hand. In compiling statistical data for 1942, therefore, it has been necessary in some cases to repeat figures used in previous years' reports.

Because such meager information is obtainable from large sections of the world territory, this report for 1942 is being confined almost wholly to the North American field, only summaries of the latest statistical data available being given for other divisions of the General Conference. It is recognized that this information from countries outside of North America in many instances is only approximate; but the final totals are undoubtedly on the conservative side.

Following are the latest reports of church membership from the several divisions of the General Conference compared with previous years:

NORTH AMERICA

At the time of the organization of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, May 21, 1863, four local conferences were already in existence—Michigan organized October 6, 1861; Minnesota, October 4, 1862; New York, October 25, 1862; and Ohio, February 22, 1863—and two more completed their organization later the same year—Vermont, June 12, and Iowa, September 20. At one time during the eighty years since the General Conference was formed, there were 74 local conferences and regularly organized missions in the North American field, but combinations have been made so that for more than ten years the number has stood at 53.

Church Membership

The six conferences during the first General Conference year had 125 churches and approximately 3,500 members. Numbers have grown during the four score years to 2,659 churches and 197,215 church members in North America at the close of 1942.

No records were kept of the number of institutional and miscellaneous workers connected with the Seventh-day Adventist cause before 1907; but there were some 30 ordained and licensed ministers in the denomination in 1863, which with other workers connected with the conference work has increased to 3,367 in 1942. Including workers in institutions, the total number of laborers in the North American field in 1942 was 10,794. (See Summary 1.)

The ten years between 1872 and 1882 stand out as the decade of greatest membership expansion in Seventh-day Adventist his-

tory, based on the number of church members at the beginning of the period. Church membership in 1882 was almost three and one-half times that of 1872, or a ten-year membership gain of 240 per cent. The next two decades each nearly doubled their beginning lists of members, bringing the Seventh-day Adventist church strength in 1902, forty years after the General Conference organization, to 53,279 in the United States and Canada.

Due in part at least to the introduction of membership goals as a factor in the collection of mission funds, church membership lists were carefully reviewed during the ten years from 1902 to 1912, one year—that of 1910—recording an actual decline of over 1,000 church members. In several other years of this period the annual membership gains were only a few hundred; and the total increase for the ten years was 10,486 members, or less than 18 per cent of the beginning church roll.

The highest membership gain in a single year since 1902 over that of the previous year was nine members per 100 in 1917. The increase in 1915 was eight members for each 100 members at the beginning of the year. The membership growth in 1942 was a trifle over three members for each 100 on the church lists at the beginning of the year, which is slightly less than the 3.2 per cent average annual membership increase for the past forty years.

At the end of 1902—forty years after the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists was organized—the church membership was more than 16½ times what it was at the beginning of 1863. The 1942 membership was less than 3½ times its size at the beginning of the second forty-year period in 1902. (For annual membership increases, see Summary 2.)

Seventh-day Adventist church memberships in any given locality are increased by the baptism of new converts, by profession of faith of those who have been baptized previously by another denomination, and by letters of transfer from other Seventh-day Adventist churches. Decreases in membership result from death, from apostasy, from members unaccounted for, and from letter transfers to other churches.

On an average for every 100 members received into the churches of North America in 1942, 82 were transferred to other churches or otherwise dropped from the church lists.

Laborers

In 1942 an effort has been made to record the total number of workers in North America to whom ministerial credentials and licenses and missionary credentials have been issued by the conferences. Some of these workers holding conference papers are employed in schools, sanitariums, and other institutions. In computing the grand total of laborers in both evangelistic and institutional work in North America, it is necessary, therefore, to eliminate the duplications where workers are counted in both groups.

On account of a little confusion in reporting from the fields at the close of 1942, the number of workers given credentials and licenses by the conferences has been taken for the summaries of this report from the conference lists furnished for the Year Book, with the exception of colporteurs which were not so reported.

The total number of laborers connected with the Seventh-day Adventist denomination in North America at the end of 1942 stood as follows:

Tithe and Offerings

Records are not available giving the exact amount of tithe, or systematic benevolence as it was then called, paid by Seventh-day Adventist believers during the earlier years of their denominational history. It has been estimated that in 1863, the year in which the General Conference was organized, about \$8,000 tithe was received by the conferences. With the increase in church membership and the firmer establishment of the tithing system, the annual tithe in 1872 had tripled that of 1863. Membership growth resulted in another tripling of annual tithe receipts at the end of the next ten-year period in 1882. Again in 1892 the tithe collected in the North American field was three times what it was ten years before; and the average per capita tithe had also increased more than 60 per cent, reflecting a period of greater financial prosperity for Seventh-day Adventist members or a stricter adherence to the tithing principle.

Between 1902 and 1912 the tithe receipts in the United States and Canada doubled in amount, and the average annual tithe paid by each church member increased from \$9.01 to \$16.53. The tithe in 1922 was almost three times that of 1912, and the yearly membership average had nearly doubled to \$31.97. The lowest amount of tithe recorded in any single year since 1918 came in 1933 when \$2,715,869.67 was received in North America, or a membership average of \$18.89. The tithe of \$9,088,347.55 in 1942 in the North American field was more than three times the receipts in 1933; and the 1942 per capita tithe of \$46.08 was nearly two and one-half times the 1933 average. In 1942 tithe was the highest in annual amount and in membership average ever received in the history of the Seventh-day Adventist denomination. (See Summary 3.)

Mission Offerings

The first accumulated total of mission offerings given by Seventh-day Adventists is recorded in 1869 as \$1,800.75. In 1902, thirty-three years later than this, \$148,683.75 was contributed to foreign mission work. This was an offering of \$2.55 annual average for each church member, or a fraction below five cents for each week of the year. By 1912 mission offerings of \$464,527.17 had a little more than trebled the 1902 figure, and the average yearly contributions were \$6.76, or 13 cents a week for each member.

The 1922 mission donations of \$2,165,994.00 were four and one-half times those of 1912, and the annual membership average of \$21.42 was three times the per capita amount ten years before. Each church member gave an average of 41.1 cents for each week during 1922. The low depression year of 1933 netted \$1,692,744.76 in mission offerings, an annual membership average of \$11.77, or 22.6 cents per week.

Between 1933 and 1942 the mission contributions have more than doubled in amount from \$1,692,744.76 to \$3,741,763.89, and the average individual offering of \$18.97 for the year and 36.5

cents per week in 1942 are about 60 per cent higher than in 1933. This membership increase in mission giving in ten years compares not too favorable with an individual growth in tithe payments of almost 145 per cent. The weekly mission donation for each member in 1942 was less than half a cent more than for the 25 year average from 1917 to 1942—25 year average, 36.1 cents; 1942, 36.5 cents. (See Summary 4.)

Home and Local Offerings

The first general listing of contributions for home and local church work in the United States and Canada was made in 1905. The largest average annual individual payment for this work was \$13.73 a member in 1919; and the low point since 1914 came in 1933 with \$6.29 for each church member. The \$2,885,128.59 home offering in 1942 was more than two and one-half times that of 1933; and \$2.04 per member above 1941. (See Summary 3.)

Sabbath Schools

Early in the history of Seventh-day Adventist churches, the systematic study of the Word of God was recognized as an essential to Christian living. Sabbath schools were conducted and lessons prepared so that groups of believers in different localities might cooperate in their perusal of similar Bible topics. Sabbath schools, more or less regularly organized, have been conducted by Seventh-day Adventist adherents since 1853, but it was not until 1877 that these schools were grouped into conference Sabbath school associations. The first of these state organizations was that of California formed in August, 1877, with Michigan following within a few weeks. The General Conference Sabbath School Association was organized in March, 1878.

The first full report of Sabbath school work published for 1879 showed 488 schools with 13,860 members. In the 65 years of organized Sabbath school history since 1878, the number of schools has increased in North America to 2,944, and the membership, to 176,766 in 1942. Sabbath school membership has fluctuated during these years from 73 to 123 Sabbath school members for each 100 church members, with an average of 98 Sabbath school members for the entire period.

Early Sabbath school offerings were devoted almost exclusively to the purchase of supplies and other organization expenses of the local schools. The first Sabbath school gifts to missions were taken in the Upper Columbia Conference in 1885, and this good example was followed shortly by the California field. Thereafter the interest in mission giving grew rapidly, although it was 1912 before an average weekly Sabbath school contribution of five cents a member was reached in North America.

The first Sabbath school million dollars raised within a calendar year in the United States and Canada was recorded in 1920; and every year since that time, with the exception of 1933, 1934, and 1935, more than a million dollars has been contributed to missions through the Sabbath schools. In 1942 the million dollar mark was nearly doubled by the receipt of \$1,875,005.02.

In 14 of the 23 years including 1920 to 1942 the funds raised for missions through the Sabbath schools in North America exceeded those from all other mission sources in the Seventh-day Adventist church. The tabulation following gives the offerings to missions during these years.

During the ten years from 1921 to 1930 the Sabbath schools raised an average of 22.8 cents a church member each week. For the next ten years to 1940 the weekly average was 13.8 cents. 1941 recorded 15.4 cents, and 1942, 18.3 cents each week per member. (See Summary 5.)

Young People's Missionary Volunteers

Although from early times much interest was taken in the young people of the Seventh-day Adventist church, the General Conference Young People's Missionary Volunteer Department was not organized until 1907. Records that year showed 376 young people's societies with 6,854 members. The development through 35 years has expanded the number of societies in North America to 2,133 at the close of 1942 with a membership of 44,973. Contributions gathered in the societies in 1942 totaled \$169,925.84, although this sum represents but a small part of the results of young people's activities in helping to support the cause of missions and general church work. Sabbath school donations by young people, Ingathering, and other general church and campaign funds are recorded among the regular receipts of the church instead of through the young people's societies. (See Summary 6.)

Educational Work

Organized educational work among Seventh-day Adventists began in 1872. When complete summaries of schools were first published in 1903, the elementary and intermediate list in the United States and Canada showed 391 schools, 453 teachers, and 7,609 pupils. Eleven colleges and academies had 135 teachers and 1,763 students.

By 1920 the number of church schools had nearly doubled to 716, and the enrollment was 17,510, or 183 elementary pupils for every 1,000 church members at that time. The growth since 1920 has not been so rapid. In 1942 there were 784 elementary schools with 18,943 pupils. The average number of church school students in 1942 was 96 pupils for each 1,000 church members.

Seventh-day Adventist college and secondary school enrollment in 1920 was 8,120—85 students for every 1,000 of the church membership. In 1942, 15,302 college and academy students averaged 78 for each 1,000 church members. The following tabulation is of interest:

The progress that has been made during the past twenty or more years in staffing and equipping Seventh-day Adventist church schools is borne out in part by the fact that the annual cost of maintaining these schools has more than doubled over this period, and that there has been a consistent increase in the number of teachers employed. (See Summary 8.)

Medical Institutions

Information regarding the work of Seventh-day Adventist medical institutions has varied considerably from year to year. Prior to 1913 and beginning again in 1933, self-supporting medical units cooperating with denominational principles have been listed in the annual statistical reports. The reports from a number of these self-supporting units have come in rather irregularly through the years, and usually only those sending in current data have been included.

The investment value of buildings and equipment used for medical purposes in sanitariums, hospitals and treatment rooms in the United States and Canada is now nearly five times what it was in 1910. (Property values are given only for denominationally-owned institutions.) More than three times as many physicians are connected with Seventh-day Adventist institutional work, and the 4,238 nurses and other medical workers in 1942 are more than four times the number in 1910. (See Summary 9.)

Publishing Work

Among the early agencies employed in the proclamation of the Seventh-day Adventist message was the literature ministry. Previous to 1850 a number of pamphlets and papers were published, and in November of that year the present general church paper, the *Review and Herald*, was started. The *Youth's Instructor* appeared in August, 1852. Tracts, pamphlets and books were distributed by gift and sale. Subscription books dealing with various phases of Christian experience and doctrine were later sold by colporteurs.

Book and periodical sales first reached the one million dollar volume in the United States and Canada in 1910. Ten years later, in 1920, the sales were more than quadrupled, the retail value of book and periodical sales that year reaching the highest mark that it has ever attained in North America—\$4,309,489.43.

In the deep depression year of 1933, literature sales dropped to a little better than a million and a half dollars; but by 1942 it had built up again to the second highest place, \$3,660,176.92.

Beginning with 1941, the estimated value of Ingathering campaign papers was omitted from the total of retail literature sales by the publishing houses. This plan has resulted in an annual reduction from former years of around \$500,000 in sales.

Counting general publications, union conferences papers, and school and other journals, during 1942 the publishing centers in North America were issuing 110 different periodicals; and the houses published books, papers and other literature in 28 languages in the United States and Canada. (See Summary 10.)

Church Property and Investment

The first tabulated record of Seventh-day Adventist church buildings and their estimated value, was gathered in 1907. At that time 996 church buildings in the United States and Canada had a seating capacity of over 150,000 and were valued at about \$1,127,000. Thirty-five years later, in 1942, 2,001 church buildings were valued at above \$9,000,000 with seats for approximately 350,000 persons. Notwithstanding inadequate church facilities found in some congested areas, the figures given above seem to indicate that in the North American field as a whole, for every 100 Seventh-day Adventist church members in 1907, 230 seats were available in the church buildings; and in 1942 there were more than 175 places for every 100 members. (See Summary 7.)

Shortly after the General Conference was organized, in 1865 it was estimated that the entire investment in Seventh-day Adventist institutions and conferences in North America amounted to \$39,000. Forty years later in 1905, the investment value was reckoned at \$3,500,000. By 1920, property values had risen to more than \$20,000,000; and the latest returns in 1941 show this figure doubled. The average denominational investment for each church member in 1941 was \$216.09. (See Summary 11.)

Resume

During the little more than twenty years from 1920 to 1942, the membership of Seventh-day Adventist churches in the United States and Canada was more than doubled, showing a net growth of 106 per cent. Property investments in institutions and church buildings expanded practically 100 per cent. Tithe receipts increased 132 per cent; mission offerings, 62 per cent; and contributions for home and local work in 1942 were 86 per cent more than in 1920.

Most of the departments of Seventh-day Adventist endeavor in North America made substantial progress during these two decades. Medical facilities and activity expanded markedly; literature sales are again approaching the all-time high mark of 1920; college and secondary school enrollments have almost doubled; and church schools show some gains in numbers. Sabbath school and young people's interest record advancement in their respective lines. The blessing of God is evident in the progress being made by Seventh-

FOOTNOTES—TABLE 2, SECTIONS 4 AND 5

(a) The system of educational work outlined by the Educational Department of the General Conference in 1906, comprising sixteen grades, or years of study, is arranged as follows: Church schools (information concerning which will be found listed under columns 23 to 27 in Table 1), grades 1-8; intermediate schools, grades 7-10; academies, grade 9-12; colleges, grades 13-16.

The College of Medical Evangelists gives a four-year medical course based on two or three years of college work; and the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary offers one year of graduate class study above the regular college degree course.

Section 5 of this report—intermediate schools—includes some schools doing eleven grades of work and even a few carrying classes in the twelfth grade, but which are not organized as regular academies. No school with less than ten pupils above the eighth grade is listed, but the number of secondary students in intermediate schools not shown here is given in the total designated, "Students above Eighth Grade in Elementary Schools." Only pupils above the eighth grade are considered secondary students.

Information here shown for buildings and school facilities, student capacity and enrollment, and the number of teachers and other employees, is given as of about February, 1943, which is after the opening of the second semester of the school year. The number of graduates and students entering denominational work are for the school year ending in May or June, 1942.

(b) The "capacity" of schools is the number of students that may be accommodated in classes, and does not refer to dormitory or boarding accommodations provided. Buildings and student capacity of academies connected with colleges are included in the college figures.

(c) The number of teachers in elementary schools connected with college and secondary schools are included with other church school teachers in Table 1, column 24, and are not counted here.

(d) The grades taught in each school indicate the kind of work undertaken, as outlined in note (a). Intermediate schools are noted as teaching grades 1-10, etc.

(e) In the column indicating laboratory facilities the word "No" occurs where the schools have none; the word "Yes" is used in connection with schools having such facilities. These facilities cover one or more lines of work in various schools as follows: Astronomy, chemistry, physics, histology, zoology.

Schools having facilities for manual training are indicated by "Yes" in corresponding column; those not having such facilities are listed with "No" opposite. These facilities include one or more of the following: Carpentry, cooking, farming, dairying, nursing, printing, plumbing, horticulture, dress-making, tent-making, broom-making, brick making, etc.

(f) Column 15 shows the total number of graduates in finishing courses in the academies and colleges. No graduates are counted below the twelfth grade. Graduates are for the school year ending in May or June, 1942.

(g) Column 19 gives the number of students (not graduates alone) reported as entering some regular line of denominational work. Student colporteurs selling literature during the vacation period, and persons continuing training in nurses' or medical courses are not considered as definitely entering denominational service at that time.

(h) In 1942 the College of Medical Evangelists graduated 77 students from the medical course, and five from the dietetics course. The Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary and Pacific Union College each conferred three master's degrees.

(i) A number of students taking classes with the Home Study Institute are also enrolled in regular college and academies, and the most of the students studying with the Home Study Institute are carrying only one or two classes each.
