




(Through Year-End 2018)


LOSSES

(Through Year-End 2018)






In the 54 years since 1964, 37,592,451 people have been members of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

MEMBERS WHO LEAVE




Since 1965, 37,592,451 people have become members of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.














TITHE PER CONGREGATION


TITHE PER CAPITA


