- Brains are used by the smart




Comparisons are Odious

Right Goal! Wrong Methodology!


- Their goal of success was good.

- and whoever wants to be first must be your slave" Verses 26-27



Exodus 32:30 (NLT)

"Moses said to the people, "You have committed a terrible sin, but I will go back up to the Lord on the mountain. Perhaps I will be able to obtain forgiveness for your sin.



Exodus 32:31–32 (NLT)

Oh, what a terrible sin these people have committed. They have made gods of gold for themselves. ³² But now, if you will only forgive their sin—but if not, erase my name from the record you have written!"



Mark 9:33–37 (NLT)

After they arrived at Capernaum and settled in a house, Jesus asked his disciples, "What were you discussing out on the road?" But they didn't answer, because they had been arguing about which of them was the greatest. He sat down, called the twelve disciples over to him, and said, "Whoever wants to be first must take last place and be the servant of everyone else."



Jesus the Servant


- * He came not to show off his worth,

Two Approaches To Leadership

Personal dominance

 Unified, clear direction that is based in the worldview of the leader.

Interpersonal influence

- Direction is based on a negotiation of differences integrated in the leader's perspective.

Personal Dominance Leadership


- I am in charge just do as I say!!

- Are there still some College Presidents that function that way?






Interpersonal Influence


Leadership is not only for:




- Those who are elected to an office.

The Response Of Some

Relief

- "I am glad that it isn't my problem."

Assign blame

- "The walls are broken down – I wonder whose fault it was?

Satisfaction

It looks like they finally got what was coming to them.

Pride

- "We are better than they are."


4. The Servant Leader Is Available



7. Servant Leaders Listen

- Now the men and their wives raised a great outcry against their Jewish brothers.

 Servant leaders listen.

Answers And Questions

 - To then give expression to the corporate reality.
 - To paint a picture of the corporate goals of the church.
 - To project a vision.
