Summary of Findings

- 1. A big gain and loss in membership happens in youth group.
- 2. Church conflicts and adult members' dual life (hypocrisy) become main causes of youth's loss.
- 3. Teaching doctrines usually prevents youths from leaving churches.
- 4. Extravagant public evangelism in the short term and instant baptism have been the cause of the big loss. Public evangelism should be planned and prepared only as a means of reaping.
- 5. Changing the church atmosphere is a significant part in retaining members.

- 6. High retention rate is deeply related to the strength and health of small group ministry.
- 7. Usually many dropouts are coming from the new believers within a year.
- 8. Pastors get confused about what discipleship training is and what it means. That's why they don't know how to start and progress it. Discipleship training guideline is needed and pastors should understand it all first.
- 9. The absence of follow-up course and discipleship training causes the big rush of membership loss.
- 10. Appropriate connection of college students to the local churches should be made before their graduation.

- 11. All believers should be involved in any kinds of church ministry and activities. Participation is absolutely needed.
- 12. In each level of church organization (local church, Mission/Conference, Union, and Division) and each institution, retention and reclamation should be discussed and tackled by organizing such a committee.
- 13. Invitation to music concert is working in reclaiming the former members. The appeal with a short message near the end of it should be made.
