The question of using a large portion, if not all, of our 1952 special appropriation for this project was considered at considerable length. There are many urgent special needs in various parts of the Division. Nevertheless, the work of the College is essential and necessary to the training of workers for the entire field. The brethren recognized that if we went forward with this project it would mean delay on other special projects which are needed, yet there was a spirit of cooperation manifested in doing what would serve the best interests of the work as a whole.

RECESS

At this juncture a recess was declared so that the brethren just in from Egypt and Persia could see the tract of land under consideration.

REASSEMBLED

The committee reassembled at 7:00 P. M. and were lead in prayer by Brother Zytkoskee.

Further consideration was given to purchasing the land which the committee had seen in the afternoon,

VOTED, To authorize the purchase of the tract of land under

consideration, and to proceed with plans to dig a well and install our own water system for the college. \$ 42,000.00 recently voted by the General Conference as an advance against our 1952 special appropriations to be applied for and used in financing the transaction.

The chairman called upon Brother Wilson to make a statement in regard to the facilities that are available in Egypt for the production of such lessons and the cost of same. Following Brother Wilson's statement. there was a general discussion of the advisability of entering into this proposition. It has been our hope all along that this line of broadcast could be an entering wedge for later religious broadcasts. It is difficult at this juncture to evaluate the benefits that might accrue from Voice of Home Lesson broadcasts, either from the standpoint of tangible results or as building up favor for future religious broadcasts. Brother Wilson reported that there are facilities available with competent personnel to produce the lessons, and the master copies would cost LEg 25.000 per A year's supply of 52 lessons would cost US\$ 3,500 When Elder Wickman was with us, he encouraged us to go forward with such a project, expressing willingness to cooperate in meeting the cost of production.

VOTED, That we request the General Conference Radio Department for \$ 3,500.00 to meet the cost of preparing 52 Voice of Home broadcasts for one year.
