CAIRO CHURCH
BUILDING--ADVANCE

During recent months the brethren of the Egypt Mission have given very careful study and consideration to securing a lot on which to erect a church building for Cairo. A very desirable location has been found in the central area near the railway station. On investigation it has been found that this particular lot is outside the circle of a government development project in the railway station area. The lot has a four-story building on it, which is old, and which it is estimated can be wrecked and about £Eg. 4,000

realized from salvagable materials. The owner is asking fEg. 15,000 for the lot and the building. The Nile Union has about fEg. 8,000 from church extension funds to apply on the project. It is very important that something be done in the near future to finalize on a church location for Cairo, because prices are continually rising. Since the brethren in Egypt have assured us that there is no reason to question the location recommended from the stand point of future development projects encroaching upon the lot in question, it was

VOTED, To authorize an advance of up to fEg. 3,000 to the Nile Union and the Egypt Mission, with the understanding that this amount will be deducted from any special appropriations that may be available for the Nile Union for 1954; and further

<u>VOTED</u>, To request General Conference approval on this project.
