Brother Hasso's request, briefly stated, is that Wadie Farag be sent away from Beirut, thus separating him and Brother Hasso's daughter Dola, now residing at Beirut, in the hope that they would lose interest in each other and thus change their minds about getting married. Several months ago their engagement was formally announced on consent and suggestion of Mrs. Nasif Hasso. In the discussion it was pointed out that the objective of effecting a separation, from the standpoint of distance, could be realized were Brother Hasso to take his daughter to his home in Baghdad. Brother Wadie told the committee that all the efforts, over a period of years, to break up his and Dola's love affair have tended to deepen their love for each other rather than lessen it, and that he personally had no suggestions to make or solutions to offer for the item under consideration. Sympathetic study was given to the request from Brother Hasso, but the committee did not see the wisdom or justice of dismissing Brother Farag from his work at Division Headquarters, a General Conference appointment, and since there was no willingness expressed on the part of Brother Farag to eliminate himself from this center and from his work, it was
