C. D. BROOKS CAIRO CENTER 66/173 <u>VOTED</u>, To reaffirm our action #66/99, passing on to the General Conference and the Columbia Union Conference an invitation for C. D. Brooks to hold a series of meetings in the Cairo Center and that this effort be for a period of four months beginning January 1, 1967. A. N. BARLAS TRAVEL EXPENSE 66/174 VOTED, To grant a special aid to A. N. Barlas of CyE 34.295 which represents one half of his travel expense for a trip to England. This is paid in lieu of a moving allowance and with the understanding that he will reside permanently in Cyprus.

A. N. BARLAS SUSTENTATION RATE ADJUSTMENT 66/177 VOTED, To adjust the sustentation rate for A. N. Barlas in harmony with the Division policy (Working Policy, p. 139; MED Minutes, 66/11) and set his rate at 60 per cent, retroactive to July 1, 1966. This is based on a service record of over forty years.

BICYCLES FOR COLPORTEURS 66/178

VOTED, To approve the plan for the purchase of bicycles by colporteurs presented by the Publishing Department. The details of this plan are filed in the office of the Publishing secretary.

MEC SPECIAL APPROPRIATION ADVANCE 66/179 For some time the sewerage system of the Middle East College has been entirely inadequate. Overflow from the septic tanks and other outlets in the area has been considered as the breeding place for mosquitoes, giving rise to many complaints against the school. After numerous warnings the government set a deadline of fifteen days within which time the college was ordered to correct the situation or pay a heavy fine. This time limit was extended until the board members could return from the General Conference session but it was clear that further delay would bring serious consequences. In view of this emergency situation, it was

VOTED, To grant the Middle East College an advance of LE 25,000.00 to be charged against their 1967 special appropriations. This amount would complete the first step in the over-all plan and represents approximately one half of the amount required for bringing the sewer system into harmony with the master plan adopted for the college.

ADJOURNMENT

Before adjournment the chairman asked for the reading of a letter written by the General Conference president, R. H. Pierson, calling for workers and members to enter into a new spiritual experience to the end that the work of God might be quackly finished in our time. After appropriate comments all joined in a season of prayer. Adjournment at 4:30 p.m.
