TREASURER'S REPORT

Juan R. Prestol, Treasurer of the North American Division, presented the Treasurer's Report entitled, "Still the Cornerstone."

Last year our scenario included adding one (1%) percent to the Defined Contribution (DC) Plan, the increases in medical costs and in insurance premiums, U.S. market declines, remuneration scale changes, cost of living, and the impact of the new DC retirement calculations.

The treasurers recommended budget impact studies, and urged the group to develop priorities and a time line. In *Education*, page 267, Ellen G White recommends that we do our "best in the work that lies nearest," that we "commit our ways to God," and that we "watch for the indications of His providence" when facing uncertainty. The assumption in this statement is that God is in control. With that thought in mind, we concluded last year and moved onward.

The results of the operation for 2002 gave us a division-wide 3.3% tithe increase over 2001. I was glad to see that we had an increase and that it was above the Consumer Price Index (CPI) level. The United States CPI for urban areas, which is the measure we use to track cost of living and inflation in our office, was 2.4% as of the end of December. With a per capita increase last year at of 1.24% over the previous year, our tithe per capita reported in the statistical report was \$751.48. The highest tithe increase was recorded in Canada. Atlantic came a very close second to Canada. The highest per capita is a tie between the Columbia and North Pacific unions. We experienced a decrease of 1.6% in the world mission fund offerings.

The summary of operations is reported to you in a consolidated statement, which includes the Adventist Media Center, Adventist Information Ministry, the North American Division Evangelism Institute, Seminars Unlimited, and the division office. The consolidated statement shows an increase in assets, a decrease in liabilities, and an increase in net assets in 2002 over 2001. Overall, last year (2002) ended being a good year for the division and its

entities. We closed the year with an increase to net assets of \$7.5 million, a significant increase over the previous year, which was only \$3.4 million. Our percentage of liquid assets to commitments increased from 104 to 174, and the percentage of recommended working capital decreased from 113% to 104%

The breakdown of the tithe dollar was 75.25 cents used either in the local conference or on behalf of local conference programs and 24.75 cents used outside of the local conference. From the 24.75 cents about 7.1 cents of each tithe dollar covers the unions, the division, and the General Conference operations. So it is much less than 10 cents a dollar. Last year tithe across the division was \$707 million. It is interesting that when I came to the division at the end of 1996 the tithe was \$507 million, and over the last seven years we have received increases amounting nominally to \$200 million. So we have moved from \$507 million to \$707 million in seven years—an average of \$28.6 million a year.

The economy in the United States shows signs of renewed vitality, but it is moving very slowly. Interest rates are still very low and inflation, although inching upward, is still low. The discount rate is at an all time low.

The Canadian economy reports show signs of improvement, but its unemployment increased from 6.8% to eight (8%) percent, and the Toronto Stock Exchange, down from 10,004 to 7,421 at the end of September, shows room for improvement. The Canadian economy reflects the impact of the changes in the US economy.

Bermuda is just beginning to recuperate from Hurricane Isabelle that did extensive damage to the Island a few weeks ago. We anticipate that Bermudians will rebuild and will soon be thriving again.

Last year the North American Division entered into an agreement with the North Pacific Union where we now own the significant development of eAdventist.net, which is the membership program, web based, but it's more than a membership program. It is a portal into the web.

We also have added C Michael Park, former treasurer of the Georgia-Cumberland Conference, to our treasury staff. He is in charge of SunPlus-North America. This accounting software, to be deployed at the beginning of this coming year, involves general ledger, remittances, and payroll.

The remuneration and health care premiums have been implemented across the division. We have 40 conferences out of 58, nine unions, and the division that went on the new remuneration scale as of July of 2003. There are 18 conferences that did not start the program as of July. A few are going to move into program in September of 2003 and January and July of 2004, and we have not received reports from six conferences as to their implementation date.

In summary 90% of the field has either started or is planning to start within the next 12 months. About the new 102% level for ministers, 42 conferences are implementing it, 11 have yet to do so, and we did not receive responses from four of them. The unions and the division have begun the program. Eleven entities have implemented ERI standard between 91-100%, 20 have implemented between 21-90%, and 12 are implementing between 0-20%.

The report about implementation of health care premiums is as follows: 29 local conferences have premiums, 24 do not, and five of them, probably most all of them from Canada, indicate that it really does not apply to them. Six unions are implementing health care premiums, two are not, and one indicates that it does not apply to them. The division is not applying health care premiums to employees.

The North American Division is still the cornerstone because our giving per week is \$21 million; that is, every time we go to church in North America we receive an average of \$21 million (in tithe, mission offerings, and local giving)—a \$2.9 million average per day.

People are giving. How they are giving is the question. When you consider all tithe—\$707 million a year—that does not represent, I would say, more than perhaps 50% of the tithing units possible in the local church. When you add all the mission offerings that have been stagnant for the last 10 or 12 years at \$22/21 million per year, when you quantify the local contributions, amounting to \$363 million of local giving reported, I know it is a whole lot more than that. When you add all the giving that is even sometimes difficult to track—what is given to ADRA through the remittances and direct donations, what is given to Adventist World Radio, to Global Mission, to NAD specific donations and other restricted donations; when you include ASI and ASI Missions Inc, when you put together the donations and the gifts of the donors to all the media ministries—It Is Written, Voice of Prophecy, Faith For Today, Breath of Life, and LifeTalk Radio; when you add the donations to General Conference institutions from NAD members, when you add the deferred giving, when you add the monies that Philanthropic Services for Institutions fund raised from our own

members—I'm talking about the giving of our Adventist people in North America, when you add also all of the donations to supporting ministries—3ABN, Quiet Hour, Adventist Frontier Missions, etc., the grand total is \$1.3 billion a year.

Adventists in the North American Division are giving plenty. Whoever is not receiving anything is not asking for anything. Whoever is asking and promoting is getting the money. So I think it ought to tell us something as to what we have become and what we are making out of our own membership.

If you want to know how much i\$1.3 billion is per capita, it is \$1,344 and when you convert it to a percentage of disposable personal income for 2002, it is 5%. Our people are giving; they're just giving in different ways.

I want to express a word of gratitude to the Lord for providing for us so much that there are so many ministries flourishing all over the place and I want to express a word of gratitude to all of those in leadership in North America who make this report possible. Thank you very much.
