

Laying Out Our Work

Entering Many Hsiens

BY CONCERTED EFFORT

ONE of the first things that faces a man or woman following school days, when he takes up his life vocation, is how to get the most production out of his time. Even in our school days some of us recall how we had to make a schedule for ourselves and to follow it in detail in no ordinary way. Thus should every task we undertake be planned accurately, so as to make the most possible use of our time for periods sometimes extended into three and four months.

Early after the formation of the China Division, the Division Committee set for itself the program of extending the work into new territory, feeling we should not camp long around the old centers, but should go out into new territory and open up work. We also coun-

seled our brethren to acquaint themselves with the field and the people over which they had been placed as stewards, to see that the message was carried alike to every man, woman, and child; for to-day we face a work that is soon to be finished in all parts of the earth. We are confident that as the work is finished in other lands, it will likewise be finished in China.

Many of our local missions are working most successfully on the plan of mapping out each year the work that they are going to accomplish, and then seeing that the work is done within the given time.

The *hsien* seems to be one of the most natural boundaries with which to measure our work. The present estimates are that China has 1,919 *hsiens*. We earnestly hope to be in every *hsien* of the China Division within the next few years. We are making very definite progress, and we invite all our working forces to join us in the plan of measuring up

our work, and then stretching ourselves to do the amount of work we have assigned ourselves.

Our secretary, Brother C. C. Crisler, has introduced a unique feature into our quarterly and annual statistical reports, by which every director in the field may have a comparative study of the progress we are making in getting into new territory in the several sections of the field. We trust that every director will take especial pride in the record of his own field, and that we shall begin to see many souls coming into the truth in sections hitherto unworked; for as we see witnesses scattered here and there, we may be sure of a great harvest of believers coming into the church. However, for the records of such work to be of real value, it will be necessary for everyone to co-operate in supplying the data, and in reporting when new territory is entered and when baptisms are made in new centers. We have been glad to see many planning thus.

The sales for the China field have hitherto been figured on the two for one basis. For the year 1932, as given above for the past year, they are figured on the two and one-half for one. If sales for the China field were figured on the regular present rate of exchange, this would decrease the gold figures somewhat.

The number of colporteurs is given on the basis of the yearly average, whereas in the general statistical tables appearing on other pages of this report, the number of colporteurs usually represents those in actual service at the close of the year.

Fifty years ago our colporteur work was started in the United States of America; and since that time it has rapidly spread until it is carried forward in every part of the world field. During the half century that has passed since Brother George A. King undertook colportage, "our colporteurs have played a major part in the spread of this message (to quote from a recent article by Pastor J. L. McElhany on "The Golden Anniversary" of colportage among Seventh-day Adventists). "It is impossible for us to estimate the wonderful results of our literature work. Many thousands of our believers owe their knowledge of this message to our literature."

NOTE.— The report given above is presented for the sake of showing a fair year by year comparison of the Sabbath school offerings. In this table the offerings are recorded in Mexican dollars, the currency of China. (not in U.S.currency), and the figures for 1932 show a slight gain over those for the preceding year. The chart below gives the financial items in U.S.currency, the figures for 1932 representing Mexican values changed into U.S.Gold dollars at the ratio of two and a half for one, whereas the ratio for previous years was two for one. This change in ratio accounts for the apparent loss in offerings for 1932, as compared with 1931. In this table, while, as stated above, there was a gain, in the currency in actual use in this field. That God has enabled His people thus to maintain their gifts for missions in a year of great financial perplexity, is cause for gratitude, and for perfect trust in Him who is able to supply all our need, "according to His riches in glory."

Efforts to Occupy New Hsiens

C. C. Crisler

Most noteworthy are the results reported in this issue, of untiring and carefully prearranged endeavor to occupy during the year 1932 as many hsiens as practicable, permanently. The net results of these efforts are set forth in the last two columns of the statistical summary on pages 8 and 9. Of the 1,919 hsiens in all China, our missions were occupying 312 at the close of last year. This is a larger total than had been anticipated. God's blessing has been with the workers. Providential circumstances have led us into many a hsiens not hitherto permanently entered.

It is recognized with gratitude to God that the colporteurs have far exceeded, in territorial scope, the endeavors of others; for they have distributed our denominational literature in perhaps 95% of all China's hsiens. In several areas,

during the past five years, they have entered every hsiens; this is their aim year by year. May they have success commensurate with their zeal and with their sacrificial loyalty to the Advent Movement.

The hope and aim of every worker in the China Division is to make the year 1933 the best we have ever seen in the matter of entering new territory. To this end, the brethren who met in Shanghai at the time of the mid-winter council last January, passed several recommendations, including the following that pertain to the surveying of territory, the setting of goals, and the entering of new hsiens:

(1) That during 1933 the movement for larger evangelism be pressed forward with all possible energy and determination.

(2) That conferences and missions having unoccupied territory make a survey of their field and place a part of their evangelistic force in such territory, with a view to extending the influence of the message and raising up churches in new places. We suggest that ministers having special talent for public evangelism be chosen and set apart for full time service in this work.

(3) That conference officials definitely study with departmental leaders, heads of institutions, and church pastors how to make their work definitely soul-winning in character, setting soul-winning goals before their respective organizations at the beginning of the year.

(4) That each local and union mission give careful study to ways and means of entering all the hsiens within his unoccupied territory at the earliest possible date, mapping out a program by which this can be accomplished through the apportionment of the task over a series of years; such arrangements to be effected in connection with the union sessions.

For our mutual encouragement, let us give close study to these recommendations, and make sure of attempting all that the Lord expects of us as those accountable for the souls of men.

And let us continue in earnest supplication that we may keep linked with divine agencies, and thus fulfil Heaven's purpose for the winning of the lost throughout our borders. In proportion as we pray, and labor on in faith, will the record for the year 1933 far exceed anything hitherto attained.

CHURCH MEMBERSHIP GAINS

Net gains in church membership during 1932 were less than those of preceding years, the total aggregating 1,015, bringing the number of the baptized believers in China up to 11,932.

The net total gains in church membership for the two-year period, Dec. 31, 1930 to Dec. 31, 1932, stand at 2,456.

On page 14 appears a Membership Chart, revealing in detail, union by union, and year by year, the running record of church membership and of baptisms.

The summary of gains by provincial missions, as given above, includes fields where the figures are relatively small, but where the difficulties have been many. God is at work in places where hindrances are multiplying.

THE SABBATH SCHOOL DEPARTMENT

A summary of Sabbath school statistics for the China Division appears on page twelve. The total membership, 17,115, is 5,183 in excess of the baptized church membership. This gives ground for large expectations in the winning of many hundreds of the Sabbath school members as regular members of our churches. The Sabbath school gifts for missions have already reached the substantial sum of \$18,540.88 gold per annum (at 2½ for 1).

THE PUBLISHING AND HOME MISSIONARY DEPTS.

For detailed information on the results reported from publishing and home missionary departmental activities, see pages 10 and 3, also the Language Table on page 2. These are self-explanatory, and reveal increases in several of the unions.

MEDICAL DEPARTMENT

ical department during the past year and two-year period. A brief summary of the workings of the institutions already opened is given on page 13.

PROGRESS BY UNIONS

Certain of the statistical tables set forth with considerable detail the progress year by year in various union fields,—see pages 4,5,6,7. A special table (page 15) has been prepared to show progress year by year throughout all China, including the three outer provinces of Manchuria.

TITHES AND OFFERINGS

Detailed summaries of tithes and offerings appear on pages 2 and 7.

WORKERS

The number of workers, both native and foreign, in service through the years, is listed in the "Membership Chart" (page 14). These totals include our school teachers, our institutional workers, and also many self-supporting workers—colporteurs and others.

THE PEOPLE AMONG WHOM WE LABOR

On page two appear tables giving populations (column one) and languages in which work is being conducted both orally and through the medium of the printed page. No table, however, can be prepared that reveals the ripeness of the harvest fields where these many millions dwell. As in Far Eastern lands we get close to the people who have never heard saving gospel truth, but who seem glad to listen and willing to believe, we learn that Heavenly agencies are indeed mightily at work, preparing the way. It is our privilege and our responsibility to plan in a manner commensurate with the providential openings presenting themselves on every hand. No statistical data can cover this vital phase of our advance; only as we turn from a contemplation of our slender resources in men and means, to the One who is leading us on and on, may we know the blessedness of walking by faith and not by sight. While past progress and present strength may be comprehended in part by a study of the tables spread before us in this issue of the *Reporter*, we must as workers and as laymen learn to put our entire trust in the infinite resources of our Divine Leader, who stands ready to spiritualize our every energy, and multiply an hundred-fold the small results of the past.
