THE ROOMY UNIVERSE

WE read concerning the Lord's children on the earth such expressions as "Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom," and the statement is that while it takes a broad road to accommodate the wicked, the righteous, who number so few, can all pass through a narrow gate. Thus our conception of the remnant church is that it will be made up of a relatively small proportion of the inhabitants of the earth, just as was the apostolic church. Yet God's provision for the unsaved world is very great. He bids everyone to come, saying, "Whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely." And again in Romans 10:12: "There is no difference between the Jew and the Greek; for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon Him. For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved."

We are glad for the record of growth in membership in this division for the past few years. This indicates that we are climbing up so that we may hope to be on a parallel basis in membership with the rest of the world divisions. Our growth has been of a balanced character. Every department of our work has shown a gain, as is revealed in the very detailed and comparative report prepared by our secretary for this number.

We trust that every China worker and all who are interested in the China field will take note of the growth in membership, total number of laborers, and institutional development. We are aware that the figures are still very small compared with what we must expect, since we hope in a few years to see a membership of 10,000 in our China Division.

Heaven is a roomy place; large provision has been made. Those who are saved will enter a kingdom with possibilities for a very wide and interesting acquaintance. John says: "I beheld, and I heard the voice of many angels round about the throne and the beasts and the elders; and the number of them was ten thousand times ten thousand, and thousands of thousands." In speaking of the number of servants about the throne in heaven, Daniel says that "thousand thousands ministered unto Him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood before Him." The kingdom was made up of "all peoples, nations, and languages."

We do not try to fix the number of the angels by multiplying ten thousand by ten thousand, but take it that this is indicative of what might be called an innumerable company of heavenly beings who are awaiting the opportunity of welcoming to paradise those whom we may, through the blessing of God upon our work, gather as the earthly church to await the coming of Jesus when He shall appear in the clouds with great power and glory.

three books, and from that time on has been doing well. "My faith is strong in the message and the literature work," he said.

Djao Min and Djao Fa, two tried colporteurs belonging to what has become known as "the bicycle brigade," reported interesting results from the last year's work. One day while working in a bandit infested area, they came to a village where the citizens, thinking they were bandits, endeavored to protect themselves against them. However they persuaded the frightened people that they were Christian workers, and were allowed to enter the village. They stayed several days, selling literature and preaching the message.

One of the younger colporteurs reported that in a certain district where he was opposed by the magistrate, he had gone in to the village and as a result of prayer and perseverance had taken over 300 subscriptions for the *Signs of the Times* magazine.

Among those in attendance were two young lady colporteurs. These young women had worked six *hsien*s during 1935, riding their bicycles into the country areas, and in two of these *hsien*s they had worked every village. They gave interesting testimonies of how they had been protected from bandits and how God had gone before them. At one place when a number of bandits planned to attack them a man unknown to them came to their rescue and escorted them safely to another village. When traveling to another village, being some five *li* away, they seemed to hear a voice telling them to stop. A man came forward and helped them to go to a village where they took eight subscriptions for the *Signs*.

At the close of the regular meeting a baptismal service was held in which a number were baptized, one being a young man who had recently accepted the truth and was planning on entering the colporteur work. At the close of the baptismal service the field missionary secretary of the Jehol Province, Brother Dzeng Tsai Ting, related the following: One night about a year ago, an old man between fifty and sixty years of age came to the chapel and knocked for admittance. This old man had come a long distance from his home in the province of Hopei, and was looking for his son whom he understood was located somewhere in the city. Brother Dzeng finally located the son and brought him back to his aged father. The father left him in the charge of our field missionary secretary and asked him to help him in any way he could. This young man began the study of the message and becoming interested in the special truths for this time, soon began the observance of the seventh-day Sabbath. He had requested baptism some time previous, but the opportunity had not presented itself. Now he had come from his home to request baptism preparatory to entering the work as a colporteur.

On the last night of the institute, goals were set by the different colporteurs and plans laid for the work of 1936. The Spirit of the Lord was present and all pledged themselves to make their work a greater soul-saving agency.

Prospects look encouraging for the literature work in the North China Union during 1936. We were greatly encouraged to see the keen interest taken in increasing the literature sales and in making their work a greater soul-saving agency.

An Unusual Colporteur Institute

It was my privilege, in company with Pastor E. R. Thiele, to be in attendance at the meeting of the North China Union Publishing Department leaders and the colporteurs of the Jehol, Cha-har-Suiyuan, and Hopei Missions, held at Peiping during the middle of February. The delegates who had been in attendance at the Hopei provincial meeting, which had just closed, were also present, thus bringing the number up to over seventy, about fifty being colporteurs.

The outstanding impression given to one visiting this institute was that of consecrated enthusiasm on the part of the colporteurs. The North China colporteurs have been most energetic in pushing the

work in the villages. Over forty rode their bicycles into the institute and planned to ride them back to their respective fields following the meeting.

The program was well arranged and the study of gospel salesmanship and drill work were emphasized. The morning Bible study was made a special feature. Studies were given in Bible doctrines and denominational history as outlined for the Junior Standard of Attainment work and an examination held at the close of the meeting. The majority of those present secured their certificates.

Those in attendance will long remember the testimony meeting on Sabbath afternoon. One brother related that when he entered the colporteur work his friends and relatives told him that no one would buy religious books and that it was useless for him to try. However, he was determined, with the help of God, to succeed. During the first three days he did not sell a single book, but he went perseveringly on. On the fourth day things took a turn and in a few hours he sold

The Russian work in the Sungari Mission is conducted in all the provinces of Manchuria, and the "missions" are not named, inasmuch they have already been given under Fengtien, Kirin, and Pankiang.

Geographical readjustments, connected with the formation of the North Kiangsu Mission during the second quarter of 1931 out of the Anhwei and the Kiangsu Missions, at which time, from these two Missions, 141 members were transferred to the newly formed organization, vitally affect the gains and losses of Anhwei and Kiangsu Missions, and should be taken into the account when making comparisons.

The actual gain is 465, inasmuch as at the time of the setting apart of North Kiangsu as a separate organization, 141 members were released to them by the Anhwei and the Kiangsu Missions.

A Unique Party

H. W. MILLER

I THINK that this is my first occasion to give a write-up of a party. I have never attended many parties, but my general experience has been that I have gone away from more than half of such gatherings questioning whether very much helpfulness, strength, or benefit is obtained by such use of precious time. However, a few evenings ago I responded to an urgent invitation to attend a little surprise party that was given to Mrs. B. Miller on her sixtieth birthday. The party had this influence on my mind from the moment I arrived until the time I left: it revealed that the Spirit of God does transform lives, that Christian grace instilled in the heart does bear fruitage among the peoples of these lands, and that the Lord does use consecrated instrumentalities for the upbuilding of His work. Along with it all, came meditations as to what after all are the real worthwhile things in life? I realize that one may often be very busy attending popular functions, which seem to be

weighty matters, and yet after they are all passed through one wonders how much actual good has resulted.

Twenty-nine years ago, it was my privilege to be in Washington. Following a talk that I had given, Mrs. B. Miller, a woman in her prime, just a little over thirty, came to me telling me that she had had a dream, in which the Lord had shown her that she ought to go to China. I shall never forget her earnestness. I was immediately convinced that this was God's opportunity for speaking to this woman, and, of course, from that moment accepted her tendered service and proceeded to make arrangements for her to come to China. She had had but meager schooling; her knowledge at that time of the English language was very limited; but she came to Shanghai where she has made her home with the people of this land for more than twenty-eight years, and where doubtless she intends to live and labor until her life work is completed.

As I looked over the company gathered together to pay their respects to this devoted mother in

Israel, I saw there much of our present native church leadership in China today. Mrs. Grace Swen, who was her second convert in China, was master of ceremonies, and spoke a few opening remarks of appreciation for Mrs. B. Miller and her service to China. This was followed by remarks from Professor B. A. Liu, whose mother was her first convert, and who also was present. Brother Liu outlined briefly her life career in China. A company of seventy was present—editors, conference presidents, college presidents, teachers, Bible women, dentists, medical workers, and many devoted layworkers, all of whom joined in their good wishes to Mrs. B. Miller.

I could say as I left the house that I could wish for many such parties in China, and the impression left upon me was this: While busy with many things in life, am I doing such things as will net such fruitage as I saw at this meeting? The text came to me, "Not by might, nor by power,"—not, as Paul says, "with excellency of speech,"—"but by my spirit, saith the Lord of hosts."

Training-Classes for Lay Bible Workers

E. L. LONGWAY

DURING the past two years six thousand copies of the booklet "How to Give Bible Readings" have been distributed among the members of our churches over this Division. During the year 1935, in the North China Union Mission alone, five hundred of our church members completed the course, and have been issued certificates of attainment.

Besides voting the recommendations concerning this line of activity as listed below, the Division Committee authorized a third edition of four thousand copies of "How to Give Bible Readings." This new edition will soon be coming from the press to be furnished to the field as needed.

I urge upon you the careful study of this series of recommendations as listed below, and your cooperation in carrying them through to complete success.

We recommend, (a) That the movement to train lay members be continued and intensified, until every church shall have trained some of its members in the work of giving Bible readings.

(b) That our colporteurs join actively in this work of giving Bible readings, and that this work be promoted in a strong way in all our colporteur institutes, making use of ten lessons made available in the book, "How to Give Bible Readings."

(c) That in all our medical and educational institutes we endeavor to conduct a class in "How to Give Bible Readings," encouraging students and nurses in training, and institutional helpers, to enroll, and to complete this course.

(d) That the home missionary secretary and the mission director keep in touch with those who have finished the course, and encourage them to persevere in their soul-saving work.

(e) That when a class has completed the course of ten lessons it continue its organization, functioning as a Bible workers' band, with the teacher or some other well-trained member of the class elected as leader of the band arranging for at least one meeting per week; and that these bands be urged to use the series of thirty Bible readings prepared by the editorial department of the Press.

(f) That the local pastor or district evangelist be urged to recognize these lay Bible workers as his helpers in evangelism, and take special interest in developing and directing their activities.

Section (e) is perhaps the most important of the series. Brother Frederick Lee, just before he left for the homeland, completed this series of thirty Bible readings. You will find them most suitable for the purpose intended. Please see that your tract society has a supply on hand to meet the calls that will soon be coming from the churches and companies in your field. Remember that March 7 is the day when this program should be promoted in all our churches.

Itineraries of our Workers

H. W. MILLER

TODAY, the 13th of March, mails have just arrived telling us of the movements of some of our workers who are in the far distant parts of our field. Brother Hall and Miss Mount accompanies Elder Wilkinson to the Yunnan Provincial Meeting, which was held in our new church the latter part of February, and which was dedicated at the time of the annual meeting at Kwenming, when about 200 members were present. Following the meeting they made a trip out to Talifu, which formerly was a twelve days journey; but through the newly opened roads they made the journey to this place in two days, held a three-day meeting, at which about 50 were present, and returned in two days by motor bus.

One of the letters received this morning was from Pastor Wilkinson, superintendent of the West China field, written on the 9th of March. He planned to leave the following day by plane for Chungking, the plane making the round trip from Chungking to Kwenming the same day. Evidently Brother Wilkinson arrived at his home as planned, because the plane that brought the letter arrived here on the 12th.

On the same mail came a letter from Brethren Appel and Crisler and one from Dr. Vinkel from the northwest. Dr. Vinkel's letter telling us that they had received a telegram of the safe arrival of Brethren Crisler, Appel, and Davies at Sining, where they were holding a meeting, having traveled from Lanchow to Sining by auto. On the return of these workers to Lanchow, they plan to set out again on an eighteen days journey, going down to Chone, from Chone to Labrang, and from Labrang returning to Lanchow.

Almost daily are we expecting word to come to us that Brethren Dahlsten and Shigley have started out from Suchow to Hami, where they expect to conduct an evangelistic effort and settle temporarily, preparatory to moving to Tihwa, which is their goal as soon as conditions warrant travel over that roadway.

While these brethren have been traveling over the rugged areas of our division in such a remarkably short time by the modern means of transportation, which more and more is being provided to the outlying areas of our division, the writer made a trip from the Shanghai Sanitarium to the China Training Institute, from building to building, in practically four hours. Some

promised surgery for the morning of March 11 made an earlier trip impossible. Leaving Shanghai at seven in the morning, I traveled by plane to Nanking, made connections with the train out of Nanking for Chiaotoutseng, and left Chiaotoutseng that evening, reaching the sanitarium the following morning to again take care of promised work. In all this not a single day was lost in attendance at the institution. Truly we are living in a marvelous age when many things heretofore unheard of and impossible of accomplishment, are in actual realization.

Statistical Report China, 1935

This "special" carries full statistical data for the year 1935, revealing the status of the China Division of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists at the close of 1935.

CHURCH MEMBERSHIP GAINS

Net gains in church membership during 1935 were less than those of preceding years, the total aggregating 1,105, bringing the number of the baptized believers in China up to 15,651.

On page 4 appears a Membership Chart, revealing in detail, union by union, and year by year, the running record of church membership and of baptisms.

THE SABBATH SCHOOL DEPARTMENT

A summary of Sabbath school statistics for the China Division appears on page 12. The total membership, 22,235, is 6,584 in excess of the baptized church membership. This gives ground for large expectations in the winning of many hundreds of the Sabbath school members of our churches. The Sabbath school gifts for missions have already reached the substantial sum of \$15,517.13 gold per annum (at 2½ for 1).

THE PUBLISHING AND HOME MISSIONARY DEPTS.

The blessing of Heaven has attended the development of the medical department during the past years. A brief summary of the workings of the institutions already opened is given on page 15.

PROGRESS BY UNIONS

Detailed summaries of tithes and offerings appear on pages 2 and 20.

WORKERS

The number of workers, both native and foreign, in service through the years, is listed in the "Membership Chart" (page 4). These totals include our school teachers, our institutional workers, and also many self-supporting workers — colporteurs and others.

THE PEOPLE AMONG WHOM WE LABOR

On pages 2 and 3 appear tables giving populations and languages in which work is being conducted both orally and through the medium of the printed page. No

table, however, can be prepared that reveals the ripeness of the harvest fields where these many millions dwell. As in Far Eastern lands we get close to the people who have never heard saving gospel truth, but who seemed glad to listen and willing to believe, we learn that Heavenly agencies are indeed mightily at work, preparing the way. It is our privilege and our responsibility to plan in a manner commensurate with the providential openings presenting themselves on every hand. No statistical data can cover this vital phase of our advance; only as we turn from a contemplation of our slender resources in men and means, to the One who is leading us on and on, may we know the blessedness of walking by faith and not by sight. While past progress and present strength may be comprehended in part by a study of the tables spread before us in this issue of the Reporter, we must as workers and as laymen learn to put our entire trust in the infinite resources of our Divine Leader, who stands ready to spiritualize our every energy, and multiply an hundred-fold the small results of the past. c.
