## A VISIT TO MONGOLIA

ON Friday, June 23, Mrs. Branson and the writer, in company with Pastor Harris and Drs. H. M. Walton and C. E. Randolph, left Kalgan by motor car for a brief visit with our workers on the Mongolian plains.

After traveling about 120 miles we came to a little village comprised of four Mongol yurts, two tents and a covered motor truck, and we realized that we had found the temporary location of Pastor and Mrs. Christensen and their family, where they are at present conducting a tent effort.

Since there had been no means of apprising them of our contemplated arrival, the Christensens were naturally surprised to see so many visitors; but being exceedingly resourceful, they contrived to absorb us into their temporary quarters and to make us comfortable.

We remained on the plains about three days, joining in the meetings that are in progress, studying conditions, and planning for the future development of our work in Mongolia.

On Sabbath afternoon we drove over to the Dolor Hodok mission, where we found Pastor J. Maltsev and family, and where we conducted a meeting for the little group of believers who gather there.

Surely Mongolia is a difficult field in which to work, because of the absolute indifference of the people to the gospel; and yet we must not consider it hopeless. No doubt even here the Lord has some chosen ones who will yet shine forth amid the darkness, and be numbered among the redeemed at last. Though the seed sown here may not yield a hundredfold, yet if it will yield ten or twentyfold, the harvest will far more than compensate for the sacrifice entailed in bringing it to fruition.

We found our Mongolian missionary staff well and apparently happy in their work. The tent meetings that were in progress were being daily attended by a group who manifested increasing interest in the messages presented; and we trust that some of these may be led to an acceptance of Christ as their Saviour.

Plans are being laid by the North China Union Mission for the strengthening of the work in Mongolia; and we earnestly solicit the prayers of all our people to the end that God may richly bless the efforts of our small and very much isolated staff that is so earnestly striving to kindle a light on the Mongolian plains.

The year 1936-37 was our best year so far as number of schools, enrolment, and teachers were concerned. The table given on page 2 of this issue makes this clear. In the summer of 1937 the picture changed. We are still in the midst of a kaleidoscopic world, and no one can predict what the final outcome will be.

### The Training Institutes

The past eight years have shown real progress in our secondary school work. Building improvements have included: (1) rebuilding the Hankow school following the flood of 1931; (2) completing the North China Union Training Institute at Fengtai in 1933; (3) opening the West China Training Institute at Dabao; (4) dedicating the Northwest Mission Training Institute at Lanchow in 1935; (5) the completion and presentation to the South China Union by Pastor and Mrs. B. L. Anderson of the girls' school building at Kulangsu; (6) the completion of the boys' dormitory, the cannery, and the hospital at Chiaotoutseng; (7) putting into operation the food factory at Tungshan, Canton; (8) the erection of a new dormitory for boys at Wenchow, Chekiang; and (9) the launching of the new building program for the South China Union Training Institute near Kowloon, Hongkong, in 1938.

## REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT

### Trend of our Church

#### School Work

There is no problem of greater importance before the China division than that of finding a way to educate our children in our own schools. Some years ago the division had a large number of church schools supported almost entirely from the regular budget. The world depression reduced the budget appropriation by several ten-per-cent cuts. Most of these cuts were absorbed in the missions by closing church schools or by putting the burden of their support on the local churches. "Self support for church schools" became our slogan and working policy.

The results of that policy were seen in a gradual increase in the number of church schools but at the same time a marked lowering of standards, and uncertain and often very low wages for teachers. It became impossible to get well-trained young people to enter the educational work.

Then the problem of registration and free public schools came from without. The line of least resistance

was to close the church schools and send the children to government schools, or for the local church members to hire some good local brother, without a Seventh-day Adventist educational background and concept, for a few dollars a month.

We overcame the registration problem and to some extent the financial problem, and there followed the rebirth of the real church school idea.

With the government favorable to our church school plan and program, now is our day of opportunity to build solidly and well. Sister White says, "When properly conducted, church schools will be the means of lifting the standard of truth in the places where they are established; for children who are receiving a Christian education will be witnesses for Christ." And again: "As believers are raised up, and churches organized, such a school will be found of great value in promoting the permanence and stability of the work." Save the children and you save the church" is as true in China as in America or elsewhere.

Our industrial work in these places has made very marked progress. Then, too, additions have been made to library and laboratory equipment in a number of places; and everywhere the 1934 course of study for the junior training institute has been adopted and our system improved.

The department's objective type tests helped to lift scholastic standards, and the annual inspection has been the means of improving many details in administration and operation.

Thus in the summer of 1937 prospects were very bright in all our institutions. Then came the crash which has resulted in the complete destruction of the China Training Institute at Chiaotoutseng, with a total loss of about U.S.\$200,000; the demolishing of the junior institute at Bengpu, north of Nanking, with a loss of about \$10,000; and the forced transfer of the Wen Kwen Tun Institute in Mukden.

Still, we have much for which to be thankful. Many others are in much deeper distress. It is fitting that this Council bow in humble gratitude and reconsecration before our heavenly Father who permits "all things to work together for good" to those who love Him.

THE HOME MISSIONARY DEPARTMENT 1935-1938

By E. L. LONGWAY

THE first two-year period of the past quadrennial term gives a total of 1,990 persons added to the church through the efforts of the laity, leaving but 1,070 for the years 1937 and 1938. Reports for these last two years are very incomplete. Yet we know that a faithful record has been kept in the books of heaven, and that none who have been faithful in witnessing will fail of the reward.

A total of 1,146,554 Bible readings was given by our members during the time under review, 762,322 of which were reported during the first two years of the period. Much of this loss is an apparent rather than a real one; for during these last two years we have not received full reports from any of the unions, and in some instances whole unions are unrepresented in these figures.

One encouraging feature of the work of the department is the great increase in Dorcas societies, the number of which jumped from 28 in 1937 to 147 in 1938. In many places our sisters have banded together for service, co-operated with other relief

organizations, and are doing a splendid work.

Another feature of the missionary work of the church that has shown a steady increase, even during these days of war, is the number of persons taken to Sabbath school or other meetings; 269,359 people have been led to the Lord's house during this last four years, and of this total many more than half are reported for the last two years of the period.

The financial campaigns of the department have been fruitful. A total of \$162,173.73 is reported from the Ingathering campaign during these years, divided over the four years as follows: 1935, \$56,248.08; 1936, \$63,304.19; 1937, \$14,737.67; 1938, \$27,833.79. The figures for 1938 do not give a true picture of the campaign, as approximately \$30,000 of the total raised last year was not reported before the closing of the treasurer's books. The returns from the annual "Big Week" campaign for the four-year period shows an income of \$21,830.77, distributed through the years as follows: 1935, \$6,242.10; 1936, \$5,294.74; 1937, \$5,385.80; 1938, \$4,908.13.

That we have been able to maintain our "Big Week" income at such a high figure during the extraordinary times of the past two years is a testimony to the faithful response of our brethren to this campaign.

The Home Missionary department, which in normal times reports an average of 1,000 new believers a year won to the truth, and which supplies the church treasury with an annual income of about \$65,000, deserves better things in the way of leadership. The division home missionary secretary is handicapped by trying to serve in two departments. In many of the unions the home missionary secretary carries one or two departments in addition to this; while in only a few of the local missions is the department secretary left free to devote his entire time to the interests of this one department. If those who are in responsible positions will provide for a trained leadership for this department and will not burden this leadership with too many other responsibilities, we can soon double the results we now obtain.

### SUMMARY

THIS issue of the Reporter presents the statistical data for the year 1938. A review of the year's experiences calls forth varied emotions,—gratitude for providences again and again repeated that have revealed the good hand of God upon us; grief for the ruin wrought on mission holdings; deep concern for our scattered and suffering church members; courage and joy for the faith and loyalty and devotion of members and workers in every part of the field.

The membership of the division at the close of 1938 stood at 18,048, with a total net gain of 659 members. Baptisms numbered 1667. A church membership chart, showing baptisms, membership gains and losses, and also the number of workers, is given on page 4, its

comparative figures covering a period of 6 years.

The Sabbath school department report, appearing on page 6, gives an average membership of 21,971, showing 3,924 in excess of the church membership, and a gain of 500 members. Sabbath school offerings, \$12,296, were a slight gain over 1937. The highest membership gains were made in the West China Union; while Manchuria had the highest per capita offering. The number of branch Sabbath schools more than doubled during the year.

Tithes and offerings receipts, \$50,113.33 gold, show a drop of almost \$25,000.

On page 6 are listed the sanitariums, hospitals and dispensaries, totaling 13. Some of these institutions had to close their doors at one time and another as the

zone of hostilities enveloped them, but reopened as soon as conditions became more favorable. Among these were the Canton Sanitarium, the Fui On Hospital, at Waichow, and the Little Eden Dispensary, at Fatshan. Others, though subject to occasional raids, continued to operate. The Shanghai Sanitarium has functioned through the year in rented quarters. All those operating in war areas have done a large work for the relief of refugees and the war-wounded.

There are 639 organized churches and companies throughout the field, and 209 church buildings. The total working force numbers 1418. These include 125 ordained ministers, 155 licensed ministers, 124 colporteurs, 325 teachers, 113 doctors and graduate nurses and 528 licensed missionaries. Others are employed in publishing, medical and administrative work.

The Home Missionary department shows encouraging gains in almost all items. The detailed report appears on page 7.

The educational work in the division has perhaps fared worse in general than any other. Church schools have dropped from 175 in 1937 to 106 in 1938, and intermediate schools from 18 to 12. Enrolments run as follows: church schools, 3449, as against 5524 in 1937; intermediate, 1630, a gain over 1937 of 203; special and college, 408, a loss as against 1937 of 322. And to these must be added heavy property losses in the complete destruction of the Senior Training Institute at Chiaotoutseng, involving some \$200,000 gold, and the Junior Training Institute at Bengpu, another \$10,000.

The losses for the year were heavy, surely, and the gains hard won. Many a well laid plan had to be given up as changing conditions made them impracticable. Yet there has been much to cheer and to encourage faith, notwithstanding. New doors have opened; new interests have sprung up in the wake of fleeing church members, and demands for the preaching of the message have taxed the abilities and the resources of our workers. With every passing year the extent of the message widens and conviction strengthens that God's great design is moving rapidly on to fulfillment, taking with it to certain triumph the remnant church in China. The losses He has permitted with the gains His providences have made possible are but part of the outworking of His eternal purpose.

## "SCATTER THEM LIKE THE LEAVES OF AUTUMN"

Every Seventh-day Adventist knows the meaning of the phrase, "Scatter them like the leaves of autumn." Every Seventh-day Adventist knows that there is power in the printed page to win souls to Christ. Every Seventh-day Adventist knows that it is his duty to have a part in the giving of the gospel to the world during these last days. Yet despite the fact that we all know these three things, it remains a fact that for the last four years we have been dropping down year by year in the amount of literature circulated by the church members in this division.

In the past four years our church members and workers have circulated a total of 2,852,617 pieces of literature throughout the field. But for every year of the four the total has been less than that of the year before. Instead of an average of only forty-eight tracts or leaflets per church member each year, we should annually be using at least 200 per person; and still we should not have reached the place where we could say that the tracts and pamphlets are being scattered "like the leaves of autumn."

Study was given to this question at the recent Division Council, and an action taken that should help us arrest this downward trend in small literature distribution and put us well on the road to attaining the goal of "a tract a day by every member." The title of this action is "Special Missionary Tract." We solicit the cooperation of every church missionary leader, home missionary secretary, and mission director in keeping it constantly before the membership of our churches. Here is the action as passed by the quadrennial council:

### Special Missionary Tract

"Whereas, The tract-a-day plan for systematic distribution of literature by all church members, the youth's evangelistic campaign, and other proposed missionary activities demands the preparation of a new, low-priced, comprehensive tract with the widest possible appeal; therefore,

"We recommend, 1. That the division ministerial, young people's and home missionary department secretaries, together with the *Signs* editorial staff, work out and prepare such a piece of missionary literature.

"2. That as soon as this material has been prepared, the field be in-

formed as to its nature, with a view to securing pre-print orders, thus assuring this tract a circulation of several million copies.

"3. That the division and union committees be requested to finance the printing of this special missionary tract on the following basis:

"a. A special offering to be taken in all churches and companies on September 23, 1939.

"b. An appropriation of \$1,000 from the ten per cent of the 1938 Harvest Ingathering funds reverting to the division.

"c. An appropriation of \$100 from the Northwest Union and of \$200 from each of the other six unions in the division.

"4. That the Signs of the Times Publishing House be requested to print this special tract on a cost basis, and that it be furnished to the various unions on a pro rata basis, using the membership at the close of 1937 to determine the proportion that shall be supplied to each union.

"5. That this tract be furnished free to the youth for their evangelistic campaigns, to such churches and companies as definitely plan to promote a systematic house-to-house, tract-a-day distributing campaign, and to our evangelists to use in their public evangelistic efforts."

Mission officers and church leaders will be pleased to know that the committee appointed to prepare and edit this tract is already at work. It is hoped to have the tract ready for distribution by the middle of this summer, thus making it available to students in their summer evangelistic campaigns. A supply will be sent to every local mission in the division.

If the churches or companies in each mission join in this tract-a-day campaign; and pledge to circulate this tract faithfully in all the surrounding territory, that will be one part of their duty and privilege in this program.

September 23 has been set as the day on which a special offering is to be taken in all our churches and companies throughout the division. The total amount received on this day will be used for a second printing of this special tract, or another one of like nature. We hope that each church missionary leader and home missionary secretary, with all mission officers, will keep this special offering in mind, and make early plans for a large offering on that day.
