TRUE FISHERMEN

HRIST was walking by the sea of Galilee. He saw Simon and Andrew, fishermen by trade, casting their nets into the sea. Accosting them, Jesus gave the surprising command: "Come ye after me, and I will make you to become fishers of men."

Fishing is a trade. It must be learned. All men can go fishing, but not all can catch fish. The difference lies in men. A fisherman is known by his catch. The inability of one and the efficiency of another to catch fish in the same waters under the same conditions can be explained only by the fact that one has learned how to catch fish and the other has not learned.

Said Christ, "Come ye after me, and I will make you to become fishers of men." Men who have heard this call to follow Christ have a right to claim the fulfillment of the promise, that they shall become fishers of men. The assurance is not that a man will become eloquent, or that the people will think him an orator, or call him great; but the promise is that Christ will make him a fisher of men.

There is a world of difference between mere oratory or even of real eloquence and the quality that makes one a true fisher of men—a soul winner. A man may be gifted in language; he may have all that the schools can give him in training, in book knowledge, in degrees, and even in positions of responsibility; he may be so eloquent that multitudes hang on his words and call him a Cicero or a Demosthenes, and yet not be a fisher of men.

The promise is, "I will make you to become fishers of men." The art of winning men to Christ is not learned in a college or a university; it is best learned by experience, in personal contact with the Great Teacher.

Too many rely upon the sermon, or upon argument, or upon anecdotes to reach the hearts of men. They count that their strong personality, their natural gifts, and their scholastic training has made them efficient fishers of men. Is it any wonder that everywhere we see failures? Inquire into the qualifications of those who fail to win sinners to Christ, and you may find education, training, native ability, and oftentimes a desire to be fishers of men. Wherein, then, lies the trouble? Can it be that they have not been with the Master, and learned of Him?

All places are not equally fruitful to the ablest fishers of men. Often there seems a special time when men can be reached with the gospel. Again, some men will succeed where others fail. What makes the difference?

Before one can largely win men to Christ, there must come into the soul a supreme longing, a great consuming passion, to be a true fisher of men. The promise is ours, "I will make you to become fishers of men." We are not told how this will be done, but that it will be done, and upon that promise we may go forward, with perfect assurance that it will be fulfilled.

Statistical Reports—1927

Years of Labor and of Progress

THE status of the Far Eastern Division of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, at the close of the year 1927, is reported in tabular form in a series of statistical summaries appearing in this issue of the OUTLOOK. The year's progress has seemed to be relatively small, in comparison with averages maintained during preceding years. However, notwithstanding local losses suffered by some union fields most seriously affected by civil strife and anti-Christian propaganda, the general trend has nevertheless been one of gradual advance. New territory has been occupied; the gospel message has been proclaimed more widely than ever before in areas outside the war zones, and God has blessed us with some gains.

Various features of denominational statistics for the Far Eastern Division, covering the work of the year 1927, are summed up in Table "O" appearing on pages 10 and 11 (center). These facts are grouped by Unions, the workings and net results for the year in every one of the provincial missions being set forth in detail. In this connection the gains and the percentage of gain during the five-year period of 1922 to 1927 are shown.

Church Membership Gains

The gains in church membership for the entire field during 1927 aggregated 1,433, an increase of seven per cent., bringing the total number of baptized believers up to 20,905.

For the preceding year, 1926, the net increase in church membership was 2,465. During the five years from Dec. 31, 1922 to Dec. 31, 1927 there was an increase of ninety-one per cent., as evidenced by the following table:

For these advances we thank God and take courage.

The membership chart given in Table "B" sets forth a number of details for study and reference, including the membership reported in former years.

Gains by Individual Unions

The total net gains in church membership during 1927, and during the five-year period 1922-27, have been realized in varying proportion from the union missions in our territory, as is shown in the "Membership Chart" (Table "B"). The losses are heaviest in South China and Central China. And this is not altogether unexpected; for the church membership have been passing through fiery trials. Some have been driven from their homes, and it is not always possible to trace the whereabouts of such. Others have migrated to parts unknown, where more settled conditions prevail. Many have been persecuted and imprisoned, and not a few have been condemned to death. With sadness we record the execution of thirteen in Central China Union alone who maintained loyalty to the faith; yet we hold as precious beyond words the memory of their devotion and constancy in the hour of supreme crisis. It is not possible to represent by mere figures and tables and comparisons the true spiritual strength of interior missions where some have stood true even unto death, and where there has been taking place what we are wont to term a shrinkage in numbers.

Some of our union and provincial leaders believe they can discern in the "goodly remnant" left unto us, a "Gideon's band" from whom we may expect great things under the blessing of Heaven in days to come. Seeming present weakness in hard-pressed and war-torn areas may eventually prove to be added strength; and our most rapid development may yet be reported from just such areas.

Gains by Provincial Missions

A detailed record of the year's showing by provincial missions, and of the status of these provinces five years ago as compared with the close of 1927, is given in table "O" on the two middle pages. This table will bear close study.

The Sabbath School Department

A summary of Sabbath school statistics for the Far Eastern Division appears on the upper half of page 19. The total membership, 24,764 is 3,859 in excess of the baptized church membership.

The Sabbath school gifts for missions have already reached the substantial sum of more than \$30,000 (gold) per annum.

Gains in gifts through the Sabbath schools, and in many other features, are listed in the annual statistics for this department appearing on pages 4 and 5; also on page 19, top.

Increases in Tithes and Offerings

The tithes for the year 1927 totaled \$16,633.96. The tithes for the year 1926 totaled \$10,000.00 (gold). Year by year, for the past eleven years, our tithes have stood as follows:

For our field, during 1927, there was an average tithe of \$6.00 (gold) per member. The average per member in the world, as late as 1897, was \$6.10; but the world average since that date has never dropped as low as our Far Eastern Division average stands to-day. Efforts are being made to bring up the tithe averages in the various fields.

The figures given in Table "J" for Malaysia, Table "M" for the Philippines, Table "K" for Manchuria, Table "P" for Japan, and Table "F" for China, bear silent witness to many steady gains.
