Why is Saturday so important?" Phon was really confused. Unlike all his other building projects, this one wouldn't let him work from Friday afternoon until Sunday morning. It seemed so strange to him to take weekly breaks when you wanted the project completed quickly.

Phon was part of the crew building the Essential Life Center in Battambang, Cambodia. This urban center of influence (UCI) features a language center, music school, and restaurant. When Phon asked his Adventist boss, Gary, about the strange weekly breaks, Gary gladly offered a short explanation about the biblical Sabbath and invited Phon to a more in-depth Bible study.

This Scripture-focused message was meaningful for Phon. He believed that the Bible was the Word of God, so he accepted the teachings with an open heart as he studied with Gary. After a while, Phon chose to be baptized and joined the Adventist Church. He wanted his whole family to know the truth, so he began giving them Bible studies. Since then, they have dedicated their lives to Christ through baptism too.

THE PHILIPPINES CAFÉ Life App

There's more than one way to plant a church, especially in the modern era. You can even start with social media if you're brave enough. In the Philippines, Reylourd Reyes had the idea to use meetup phone apps to connect young people.

He created his own group called CAFÉ Life. CAFÉ stands for Community, Authenticity, Friendship, and Experience. "It's a small group

idea," he says, "to open an avenue for young professionals to connect and hang out after work." This is how the church plant started.

With the initial small group that met up regularly, they were able to branch out into a new demographic, mostly unchurched and secular young people. The team decided to even create their own phone app for CAFÉ Life to help start more small groups throughout the Philippines.

Reylourd says that his church is utilizing social media to connect with a lot of people. The small groups also meet virtually through video meetups, and they're always meeting new people through social media. Please pray for this ministry and church planting effort.


