By the Review and our other papers all have had a chance to see that some steps have already been Workers have started for Australia, England, taken South Africa, Europe, and the West Indies. Others will follow soon to foreign parts. The scope of our work is slowly enlarging, and the funds by which this enlargement is to be sustained are to come pouring in from the brethren and sisters who believe that the time has come for the Lord to work. All who are laboring to increase the missionary interest are glad to talk with their fellow churchmembers about the progress of the work abroad. At the same time talk with them about the means that the Lord has among his people which is required for carrying on the work.

THE first-day offerings are smaller than they have been for a few quarters. A number of Conferences are not reported for, it is true, but on the whole it will be seen that the first-day offering boxes have not been so well patronized as in other quarters. We hope that the reduction is due to a response to special calls for funds in other directions, which may be expected to influence this contribution. But while calls are made, as decided at the last General Conference, for funds for enlarging the foreign work at special points, we hope none will forget to consecrate the little sums which they are able to lay by from week to week as the Lord has prospered. Our main reliance for the regular work must be placed upon the continual stream of the littles, saved here and there, and turned into the channel of foreign missions.

THE miscellaneous contributions are encouragingly large this quarter. It shows that many who from time to time find means at their command are carrying a burden for the foreign work.

THE Sabbath-school quarterly report is not received at this writing, and so we are unable to give the amount. With India as the field before the schools, we may confidently expect that the contribution will be a good one. Next quarter we will report what the schools have done for India during the six months ending June 30.

Aside from the necessities of the regular work \vee abroad, the very success of the work demands special efforts to establish our foothold in central points of importance and to enter new fields. Hence at the last Conference the following action was taken : —

"Resolved, That we recommend that calls be made throughout the field at large for \$255,000, as follows: ---

"1. For \$15,000 to build the Hamburg Mission.

"2. For \$10,000 to build the school in Australia, provided that Conference will furnish \$20,000.

"3. For the mission building at London, \$40,000.

"4. For the extension of the work in Mexico, South America, Western Africa, Interior Africa, India, China, Japan, also at Jerusalem and Constantinople, \$50,000.

"usalem and Constantinople, \$50,000. "5. For the extension of the work in fields already entered, iu addition to the appropriations provided for through the regular channels, \$40,000.

"6. For missionary work in the large cities, \$100,000."

Read Isaiah 54:2-5 and see if such a call is out of place at this time and crisis in the work.
