SPANISH GATHERING at the Study Center in Jerusalem

On Sabbath 5 September Filipinos and Ghanaians gathered in the Jerusalem International Church to celebrate fellowship and to "rejoice in the Lord."

They all now live far away from home and the fellowship they establish in Israel is extremely important for them, for their families and for their personal faith. The two communities have seen many baptisms the last

While in Israel they continue to witness and to share their faith. Those who have joined their churches also include persons of the major faith in Israel, so they are an active and inspiring element in the Israel Field.

agreed to continue exploring several potentially important avenues of cooperation.

One of the tangible results from the conversations is that Patty Cabrera, a young Israeli student, is now being fully sponsored by UNASP, Engenheiro Coelho Campus for the whole BA program. University President, Dr. Paulo Martini has initiated a sponsorship program and has graciously offered the Israel Field to send one of our active young church members to the university to complete a BA program there.

The Israel Field needs more young members with an academic background in different areas and we want to express our gratitude for this kind gesture from our friends in South America.

NEW LIFE HOPE CENTERS IN ISRAEL

In our last Newsletter we shared the great news about the new Life Hope Center in Haifa.

Now we have another one in Nazareth where Pastor Wisam Ali and his wife Adri are running language and health-programs for the community in which they live.

Years ago Nazareth Church Health and Language School had dedicated foreign workers performing community services to the people of Nazareth in the form of a language school and by teaching health principles and healthful living.

After their departure the programs were left dormant for some years, but people in the community still fondly remember the workers and have longed for such programs to restart.

This month, Wisam and Adri restarted the once popular programs to serve the community needs once more. They present weekly programs on health issues, currently presenting the eight health principles and an exercise program. Another active church member, Eugenia Dovstogan, a former handball athlete on the Russian national team, leads out in the exercise program.

They plan to present other programs in the coming months as well. The attendees at the health programs are all Arab women.

The news of the program is spreading by word of mouth and they find new members attending weekly. Some of the attendees are astounded to find that there are no idols in the church – they are used to seeing images and relics in other Christian settings in Nazareth. Some told Pastor Ali: "Your place of worship is better than that of any other religion."

When teaching children English, Pastor Ali uses computers and the course has become so popular that the students eagerly return every week.

As the informed reader will understand, there are many obstacles along the road for activities like these. Cultural and religious limitations are rampant, and we pray that the Lord will bless and protect Wisam, Adri and their daughter Rachel (8) as they continue to witness and serve in the Nazareth community.
