Elder Chase and I were impressed with our fine correspondence school and we are looking forward to greater things in the future. As we introduced three young men in Kuala Lumpur who are now ministerial interns—Toh Hock Seong, Saw Eng Chuan and Harry Ho,—I rejoiced to think how wonderful it is to have a Bible School through which these young men were first contacted. This experience alone would be sufficient to prove the value and tremendous potential of our Voice of Prophecy Bible School.

Total Evangelism for 1957 in the Southeast Asia Union

It is a grand privilege to be a servant of the Lord, living in this age when we see all about us the stirring of the nations. With breathless pace we are moving on to the brink of eternity. Even in this modern age when men can travel through space three times the speed of sound and glibly talk of the day when they will be making a trip to the moon, yet it pleases God by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe. 1 Corinthians 1:21. In Romans 10:14 the apostle asks a very vital question for which God is holding His people accountable in giving the correct answer. With Our Colporteurs in Viet-nam

For the past few weeks it has been my privilege to work with our faithful Viet-Nam colporteurs in actual field work selling our books and magazines from house to house and from shop to shop. This has been an interesting experience, and the Lord has richly blessed our efforts. Language difficulties have presented some problems but at times have also proved an asset. With the new pictorial prospectus our Chinese colporteurs find it much easier to give a quick and clear presentation of the book they are selling.

The Viet-Nameese people are not difficult to approach even in high office. During our canvassing so far we have called on four Viet-Nameese army colonels, two American, and one Viet-Nameese General.

All of these colonels purchased our books excepting the Americans who could not read the Viet-Nameese language and could not be expected to buy. One colonel purchased five sets and paid cash for the books. The sets consist of a medical book and a religious book. This same colonel also wrote a splendid recommendation for our periodicals and gave us permission to visit, clerks and other officers in the army compound.

We were fortunate in getting an interview with General Munn of the Viet-Nameese army. He listened very attentively and patiently while the canvass was given. He wrote a very fine recommendation for our literature also, and granted us free access to the army offices and barracks. He too placed the army's stamp in our signature books which proved a great help to us in visiting junior officers and clerks.

Our Viet-Nameese colporteurs are going forward in a strong way this year. During the Annual meeting the goal in sales for this field was set at one million piasters. The first quarter is not yet ended, but from all indications we feel assured the goal for the first quarter will be reached.

This is a new day for South Viet-Nam. Peace and quietness reigns in the villages and country side—such a contrast from the tension and strife witnessed a few years ago. This is also our day of opportunity, and we must work diligently and earnestly while the day lasts. The colporteurs of South Viet-Nam send their greetings to all the colporteurs in the other fields in our great Union.

A Self-supported Gospel Broadcast

It had been hoped that the gospel could be broadcast in Chinese from Saigon in conjunction with the work the Bible Correspondence school was doing. However, it was not until 1955 that I was able to obtain fifteen minutes time on the Voice of America program. This was not a religious broadcast. It consisted of weekly news reports or discussions on current events. I was able in this way to gain experience in broadcasting technique and was able to become acquainted with the superintendent and his wife of the Chinese department of the Voice of Vietnam, Radio Saigon.

During the summer of 1956 the Vietnamese government ordered all foreign broadcasting stations to be closed down. This seemed almost providential for because of this the Voice of Vietnam gained extra time including the Chinese program. I saw my opportunity so asked for time on this broadcast in which to present a religious program. It was granted immediately.

A program was prepared and recorded on tape. The problem of tape recording was a real one. However, my brother consented to let me make use of the recording room at the U. S. I. S. He arranged some time each week for me to do this recording with the aid of their technician. My brother also donated

free printing for the first program and some of the tape used. A certain brother in the church had obtained recordings of the King's Heralds quartett in Chinese. These he allowed us to use in our broadcasts. How wonderfully God works in order to supply our needs in His service when we launch out by faith on a certain project!

It was July first nineteen hundred fifty-seven that the air waves picked up the hymn, "Lift up the Trumpet and Loud let it Ring Jesus is Coming Again, flinging it far and wide. In Vietnam, the Philippines and America those who heard this broadcast wondered how Saigon could produce such music not knowing it was the King's Heralds singing in Chinese.

During the last six months of 1956 twenty-seven programs in both the Hokkien and Cantonese languages were heard over the air with fifteen in Mandarin. At Christmas time, besides the regular time allotted, nine special programs were broadcasted.

Through this means we obtained the cooperation of the Chinese newspapers in Saigon. Various news agencies featured our programs. Altogether seven speeches appeared in these papers, one being an editorial. Seven of our news reports were presented in forty-one different newspapers. Five displayed nine of our pictures and one hundred twenty-seven papers included our program in their daily radio log. One news agency sent out news about our work to all the Chinese newspapers in the Far East.

During the second half of 1956 we divided our topics into two periods of three months each. We plan to print these speeches in two small books, one for each period. The first book is already in the process of being printed. It contains one hundred sixty pages. One hundred pages contain the message presented while the other sixty pages feature interesting pictures.

The first edition would cost us twelve thousand piasters. In order to finance this plan we visited nine of our friends asking them to contribute to this worthy project. God blessed our efforts for they donated more than fifty thousand piasters. On every book each person purchased his name will be inscribed.

During the past six months our program hours have amounted to twenty-two. If we were to buy these hours we would have had to pay 264,000 piasters. According to the Voice of America's estimation we could have been charged 37,500 piasters for using the recording room. If we were to pay the salaries of those who took part in these programs this alone would have amounted to 44,340 piasters. These three items would have been most costly but for the Lord's help and direction. As it was we did not spend a cent on any one of them.

The fifty rolls of tape we used cost us 8,000 piasters. The local Mission gave us thirty-six rolls. The cost price of these being 3,000 piasters. If we compare this figure with the amount of help the mission gave us it would only be one per cent of the total cost. Since this one per cent is all we have had to pay out ourselves we can truly call this broad-

casting work self-supporting.

Shortly after beginning this plan a Sabbath preaching service was set aside in which to promote this work of the Voice of Prophecy. We pleaded with the church members to give liberally of their funds for this cause. As a result we received 4,500 piasters in cash. Another 2,500 piasters is to be received and also twenty rolls of tape. The donors are not wealthy folk but they are enthusiastic in helping to promote this divinely sponsored program.

One day not long after we had begun such broadcasting Pastor K. S. Wong and I met a friend, who had been a former classmate of mine in China. He asked whether I was the speaker on the weekly religious program over Radio Saigon, for he said he was an eager listener each time it came on the air. I had invited him to attend church services or evangelistic meetings many times but he had never accepted my invitation to do so. But now, thank God, he is hearing the Message right in his own home.

Sometime after this I went with Pastor K. S. Wong to a certain large firm in Saigon. The employees there all welcomed us most cordially telling us to be seated. I was very surprised to think they knew me so I said, "How is it you all seem to know who I am!" "Why not," they replied, "We listen to your religious program every week."

I had frequently encountered such incidents while distributing the programs to the patients in the hospital who had come from central and southern Vietnam. Many of them said they had listened to the broadcast. When our colporteurs distributed the radio logs to their customers the people often said, "I have been listening to your program."

To sum it all up we have found that practically all the Chinese in Vietnam have come to know about the Voice of Prophecy gospel broadcast. We have even received letters from listeners in Indonesia. We do thank the Lord for this.

Judging from the result obtained from this half years' work we can readily understand that the labor expended in this line of service is well worth carrying on. We do believe it has a very bright future.

However our needs are great. We are much in need of a recording room of our own. It is very inconvenient to have to use borrowed property. We waste so much time in having to wait for allotted hours in which to prepare our programs. If we could only have a standard recording room in which our own recording equipment could be installed these difficulties would be solved. We could then have a better Vietnamese program, too. We do hope at the end of 1957 that the Division will be able to apportion us a more reasonable budget with which to work.

We also hope we can revive the Voice of Prophecy correspondence school in Saigon to cooperate with the radio work. Our Chinese Bible Correspondence school was started in May of 1948, even before there was such an institution in Singapore or in other places throughout the Far Eastern Division. The Vietnamese Correspondence School was established

one or two years later. We do hope these schools can be reestablished as soon as possible.

Will you not pray that we may receive the help needed in this gospel enterprise? Do give of your prayers and means whereby this message of our Lord's soon return may be heralded to the people of this country so recently torn by war and all that follows in its train.

Conversions in Seremban

"Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth forever." 1 Peter 1:23. How very true is this for on the eighth of December 1956 three precious souls were born again to become members of the Seremban church. Their conversion did not come about by the power of man but by the word of God and through the inspiration of the Holy spirit.

In the picture, the second gentleman from the left is Mr. Cheah Yan Jen. While he was working in a rubber estate at Jementah, in Johore, he subscribed for the Signs of the Times from one of our colporteurs, Pastor Y. W. Wu. From reading this paper he learned about Jesus and longed to find a church in which to worship God. Unfortunately he could not find a Seventh-day Adventist church. The only one near him was a Methodist church. Thinking that all the churches were of the same belief because they worshipped the same God he formally joined the Methodists. He was baptized by sprinkling, their method of baptism. Later he moved to another rubber plantation at Rompin in Negeri Sembilan. Every Sunday he traveled about thirty miles to worship God in the nearest Methodist church at Gemas. Though he was very zealous in serving God yet he was quite ignorant concerning Bible truth.

One day he visited the Malayan Signs Press and was introduced to Pastor Y. H. Phang and K. T. Chin. They invited him to enroll in the Voice of Prophecy Bible Course. With Pastor K. T. Chin's information concerning his whereabouts I found him. For several months I studied the Bible with him until it was evident that he understood the Message.

By this time he realized he had not followed fully the precepts of the Scriptures. He kept the Sabbath, paid tithe and gave offerings for several months before he was again baptized by immersion.

The second from the right in the picture is Miss Chong Swee Yong. She was reared in a Buddhist home. Her interest in the truth was aroused as she witnessed the baptism of her friend Miss Wong Wai Hing and some others at the Seremban Church. From that time onwards she attended all of our meet-

ings. Rain or shine she would cycle alone for three miles to attend the services. When she discarded pork and other unclean meats from her diet she was persecuted by her mother who tried in vain to stop her from attending our meetings. As a last resort her mother consented for her to join any other Christian church except the Seventh-day adventist church. This she refused to do. Instead she received studies and after gaining a good understanding of the truth she determined to serve the Lord and be baptized into our faith. She was faithful in paying tithe and in keeping the Sabbath some time before her baptism.

The first young man from the left in the picture is Mr. Gan Chee Yean a post normal graduate. He had been teaching in the public elementary school for four years.

One Sunday night Mr. Gan attended an evangelistic meeting with one of our church members. Afterwards he approached me with many questions concerning our faith. Slowly I explained Bible truth to him until all his doubts were clarified and all his demands to understand the truth were satisfied. For months he came to our Bible studies faithfully. Though he could not keep the Sabbath while teaching in the public school yet he paid his tithe and lived healthfully for about a year before resigning from his teaching position for by this time he had determined to keep the Sabbath and be baptized at the expense of his livelihood. After taking this step by faith the Lord provided him a teaching position at our Teh Sin school in Kuala Lumpur.

Kuala Lumpur's M. V. Voice of Youth

Report from East Pakistan

NOTE—Disasters are coming upon the earth with greater frequency than ever before. Seventh-day Adventists must be ready to meet such emergencies. We as a people should feel the need of those who

suffer under conditions so distressing. Our hearts should go out to them in loving sympathy. Let us not forget to give liberally to the Disaster and Relief Offering on May 25. Please read the following article which shows how such relief is given our people and others when such calamities strike.

Repercussions of recent floods which devastated one half of East Pakistan, 25,000 square miles and affected 25 million people is continuing to be felt much longer than thought at first. The damage to crops, where 80 per cent of the people are dependent on agriculture, means the complete destruction of economy as a whole. In the delta region the flood waters do not recede for months and when the standing crops are destroyed there can be no second planting. Famine, smallpox and cholera along with tuberculosis are taking heavy toll of human life wiping out whole families in under-developed areas. Dacoity is prevalent making night travel dangerous. We have been conscious of God's guidance and protection as our members and workers joined hands to bring relief to the suffering.

Milk centers were operated and 3,000 pounds of "Milk for Millions" food and over 10,000 garments were distributed besides making cash grants to procure rationed rice, purchase of seed, replacement of lost cattle and repair of damaged houses and other rehabilitation activities. In some villages school houses were built of mud on land donated for the purpose to provide labor for those able to work. Other mission societies were invited to help us distribute relief clothing among their own members and the government magistrates cooperated in the distribution among Moslems and Hindus.

Wide publicity was given to our program of distribution by the Associated Press of Pakistan when we donated one hundred bales of relief clothing to the Governor of the Province. Reference was made to the "magnanimous spirit of Adventists in distributing relief among all classes" by heads of missions and other public officials.

Thousands migrated with only the clothes on their backs and few portable possessions in search of work and food. One of our believers was compelled to sell his portion of the land belonging to the joint family as the family had to dispose of the property to the money lender to settle debts acquired when the first flood destroyed the crop. As this land was adjoining the village school the Dorcas sisters raised funds and purchased the land for the village church and thus prevented undesirable persons living near the mission. The land was in turn given back for cultivation to our brother. But when the second came our brother had to sell the roof of his house made of corrugated iron sheets and the relief cash grants helped him to procure a straw roof for his home. The continued high cost of the staple food, rice, having risen 300 per cent or more, this poor brother was compelled to leave the village with his family of seven to go to the nearest city in search of work. While in the city the father fell sick and returned to the mission station for treatment. After

recovery he returned with a few more rupees to make a fresh start in the city.

These calamities are blessings in disguise. For one thing they have scattered our believers locating them in places where we have no believers. In one place a certain denomination offered relief to the Adventists provided they become members of that church. Our believers stated that they would rather die under the mango trees, where they were lodging, rather than change their faith. The testimony of a widow under such persecution caught the attention of a number of villagers and a group is now awaiting baptism.

One of our workers was offered land and cattle and a job to induce him to give up the truth while he was in dire need which compelled him to sell his cow in order to feed the family and educate his son at our college. We are glad that such inducements did not tempt him away from this truth. He is faithfully preparing a group of forty souls for baptism.

It is our prayer that this branch Sabbath School here will continue to be a light that will shine with increasing brightness during the years to come.

南洋神道學校一九五七年第一個禱告週，在正月十五號星期五晚上在施伯樂牧師的領導下開始。他每天主領兩次聚會，校方特安排教課的節目，使到每天能够在通常星期二及星期四週會的時間裏聚會。聚會後大家由教員及一部份學生帶領分組禱告。每一位學生都屬於一組，並且幾乎每一位學生每天都參加禱告。

晚上的聚會從七點十五分開始，施牧師的講題注重於實際的基督教。他說：『上帝把崇拜的願望放在每個人的心中，有時我們做禮拜的聖經引導我們做禮拜創造萬物的真神。只有祂能够把罪的重擔從我們的心中取去，而賜給我們喜樂

圖左起第二位謝彥仁先生前在柔佛州余文遠膠園裏服務，向本會派書員吳榮華牧師定閱一份時兆報，由讀該報的結果得認識基督，便尋找基督教堂做禮拜。可惜該地沒有本會教堂，只有美以美會教堂，他以為基督教堂都是一樣信耶穌拜上帝的，於是參加該教堂做禮拜；領過滴水禮。不久，他遷往森美州屬弄邊膠園服務，每星期日參加金馬士美以美會做禮拜。他雖然已加入教會，

總計有七篇演講稿被刊登出來，其中一篇是刊登在社論版位。我們共發出七次新聞稿，登載的共有四十一張報。有五間報館在很顯著的版位刊登我們的九張像片。在每日廣播節目中排有我們的節目，約有一百廿七份報紙。有一間通訊社替我們發出一通通訊稿到遠東各處的華文報紙。由這一切的奇妙事實，證明上帝引導這種傳福音的聖工。

印行演講稿

在一九五六年下半年度，我們所播送的講題共分爲二期，每三個月爲一期。我們把它分印成兩部小書，每期一本，第一本已在印刷中，共有一百六十頁，文字版一百頁，圖片版六十頁，共約有三萬多字和一百五十張圖片。初版印一萬冊之全部費用約需十二萬多元。感謝上帝的恩典，這件工作，我們也得到進行。我們請人預先訂購我們的書，我們用了兩三天的工夫，拜訪了九位朋友，他們付了五萬多元書價買我們的書，將來他們所買的這些書，印他們的名贈送，再由我們廣播節目中報告派送出去。屆時滿載上帝真理的書籍又會分送到好些人的手中。

趣味的統計

在這半年中，我們播送了廿二小時的節目，倘若這廿二小時廣播時間必要付錢的話，則至少我們要付出廿六萬四千元。錄音室的費用，需要三萬七千五百元。這個廣播節目的工作，倘若要付出職員的薪水，估計半年中須付四萬四千三百

四十元，以上三項是很重要的開支，也是很大的數目，感謝上帝，我們不必付出一分錢。

至於出版的部門，在半年中，兩本講道集，需要約廿五萬元的出版費，但這部門也要做到自養的地步。

至於實支的事項，如印刷傳單，信封，郵費和車費等等，總共用出一萬六千五百五十元。

錄音帶用去五十卷，約需八千元。

本區會供給三十六卷帶，約值六千元，若把此數目與全部統計比較一下，我們得到區會實在的幫助，只佔全部之百分之一。

所以這工作，實在可稱做一個自養的福音廣播工作。

熱心捐助者

在開始廣播以後不久，我們用一次講道聚會專門提倡預言之聲的工作，並呼籲弟兄姊妹們樂意捐輸，結果已收到的現款有四千八百元。還有認捐未交者有二千五百多元，和錄音帶二十卷。這些認捐者並不是很有錢的教友，但他們對於聖工却很熱心和樂意捐助。

工作的效果

當我們的節目開始播送後不久，有一次我與黃達三牧師在西貢遇見了一位多年身在國內的老同學，他說，現在西貢電台每星期播送的宗教節目是你主講嗎？我每次都有收聽。從前我會多次勸他來聚會或赴我們的佈道會，但他都沒有來，感謝主，他現在家中又可以聽到福音真理了。又

一次我與黃牧師到西貢某大公司，裏面職員熱烈地招呼我們說：『洪先生請坐。』我說：『你們會認識我？』他們說：『我們每星期都有收聽你所他講的宗教節目，怎麼會不認識呢？』諸如此類的事，已遇見不少次數。從中越南越各城市來院診症的病人，當我們派福音廣播節目單給他們時，多數人都說已有收聽過。我們的書報員到各處賣書報的時候，他們也派送福音廣播節目單給人。他們也常遇見人說：『我常有收聽你們播送的福音節目。』

今日在越南的華人，差不多都知道有我們的預言之聲福音廣播了。感謝主，我們也常收到印尼聽衆的來信。

需要與盼望

由過去半年來，我們所做的工作和所得的效果，可見得這種工作有值得繼續地發展下去，而且也有很光明和樂觀的前途。

所以我們還有很大的需要，如我們需要自己有一間錄音室，因為借用他人的地方，總有許多不便。而且錄音時，常要白費許多的時間等待。倘若我們自己有一間合標準的錄音室，就沒有這些困難，而越語的節目可有較好錄音。所以盼望不久，我們的錄音室能佈置完成，和購置我們所需要的錄音機。同時也盼望區會和聯合會在一九五七年給我們一個合理的預算，不應當只幫助我們百分之一。

播宗教節目的時候了，所以我便找個機會，向西貢電台華語部主任提出意見和要求，給我每週一次宗教節目廣播時間。我很快便得到回覆。那是在一九五六年五月底的事情。但我自己却沒有把握，因為我沒有時間預準講題，做錄音工作，或其他準備的工夫；又沒有經費；更沒有詩歌。祇有憑着信心，求主引導。

準備的工作

因為我自己沒有把握，所以我告訴華語部主

任說，要先有一個月的籌備工夫，若有把握在七月份第一個星期日，便可以開始廣播。

於是我設法召集一個混聲四部合唱，練習了數次，但我們缺少一個好的唱三音的人。

錄音的技術方面，我徵求家兄的同意借用美國新聞處錄音室，蒙他安排每星期錄音的時間，並獲得他們的錄音技師按時幫我工作。

家兄還捐給我第一期廣播節目的傳單印刷費和給我一些錄音帶。感謝主，我的問題解決了一部份。

我們的詩歌

一九五五年秋，李嗣貴牧師經過西貢，他曾帶來有兩卷君王先鋒四部合唱的詩歌，本來要收錄一份留在西貢，但因沒有時間，錯過了機會，待需要時才後悔。正在這時有一位兄弟，他託朋友在新加坡為他買兩卷錄音帶，於早幾天收到。他告訴我，在星加坡買的錄音帶已替他錄有華語讚美詩，我到他家中一聽，原來就是我所要的，也是李牧師所有的君王先鋒所唱的讚美詩歌。於是我有詩歌可用了，上帝的安排真是奇妙啊。

開始廣播

君王先鋒所唱的華語歌聲，『聖徒須宣告，使普世人聽，耶穌必定要再來』在一九五六年七月一日，開始廣播。是日，中午十一時十五分之前，我一家大小都坐在收音機邊，緊張地預備收聽我們第一次的廣播。小孩子們年紀雖然尚小，但也都非常高興和注意，甚至跟着收音機的歌聲

和唱。我們的華僑兄弟也都各在家中注意收聽，甚至有一位兄弟，他們家中有錄音機的，也從收音機把我們預言之聲的第一次和第二次廣播節目錄了下來。

越南，菲律賓和美國的同工雖然不懂華語，但他們也在那天收聽我們首次廣播。他們都很奇怪，為甚麼我們的華語預言之聲有電風琴，我們男音四部合唱，是唱得那麼好聽。原來這是美國預言之聲君王先鋒所唱的華語讚美詩歌。

一九五六年度的下半年，我們播送了廿七次的國語節目，每次半小時，共是十三小時半。國語節目播了十八次，每次十五分鐘，共四小時半。在聖誕節的時候，我們除了原有的預言之聲節目外，在廿三至廿五的三天中，我們又多獲得增加九次（共四小時）的聖誕節特別節目，所以我們華語預言之聲，在一九五六年共播了廿二小時。若是需要用錢去買這廿二小時廣播時間，則我們至少要付出越幣廿六萬四千元。（合美金三千五百二十元）

報館的合作

我們的福音廣播工作，也很得到西貢華文報紙的合作。他們刊登我們的廣播消息，演講稿和圖片，並在每日的廣播節目表中刊排我們的節目和講題。通訊社也為我們發出通訊稿。在聖誕節增加特別節目時，電台在早兩三天前，每次報告新聞時，則預告我們增播聖誕節節目的消息。

三月二十四日星期日，我們起身去檳城。那平坦的公路，沿途美麗的樹林，使我們想見太初無罪世界的美麗情景之一斑。每一轉彎拐角，我
