

Publishing the Word

"Where no counsel is, the people fall: but in the multitude of counsellors there is safety," is as good advice to-day as when it was first offered by the wise king of Israel. And it was for this reason that from April 4th to 8th the leaders of the publishing work in the Northern European Division came together at Stanborough Park, Watford, England, to discuss plans for the development and strengthening of literature evangelism in their various fields.

In view of the vital part which the ministry of literature is to play in the closing up of the work of God upon earth, it was perhaps not inappropriate that the Publishing Convention should be the first By W. L. EMMERSON

of the Divisional councils held during the present quadrennial session.

The publishing houses in the Division were represented by their managers and some of the editors, while the Union and some local Field Missionary Secretaries represented the three hundred colporteurs throughout the Division.

The General Conference very kindly arranged for Pastor C. E. Weaks, the Secretary of the Publishing Department, to be present, and his valuable counsel was much appreciated. Brethren Charpiot and Böx, the Field Missionary Secretaries of the Southern and

Central European Divisions, were also invited and contributed much to the discussions.

Pastor W. E. Read was present during most of the convention and Pastors J. I. Robison and T. T. Babienco were in attendance part of the time.

The only field not represented was Latvia, whose delegates were unable to obtain permission to leave the country.

The programme of the convention had been drawn up by Brother L. A. Vixie, Secretary of the Publishing Department of the Northern European Division, and it was largely because of his careful preparatory work and his guidance during the sessions that so much

valuable study was crowded into the days the delegates were together.

The devotional hours were times of rich blessing as Pastors Read, Weaks, Robison, Lowe, and King dwelt upon the times in which we are living and the great need of earnest, consecrated, and Spiritfilled leadership in the work of God.

The reports of the Publishing House managers and colporteur leaders showed encouraging progress in the literature work in every field. Brother S. Jonasson, of the East Nordic Union, which has the largest colporteur force in the Division, reported an increase in literature sales in Sweden during 1936 of 109 per cent over 1935, while in Finland the increase was no less than 128 per cent. Seventy-seven full or part scholarships were earned by the students in the East Nordic Union last year.

In the British field 19,000 bound books were sold by the colporteurs during 1936, this figure being larger than in any previous year.

Space will not, of course, permit reference to all the vital matters discussed. Suffice it to say that the spiritual aspect of the literature ministry was uppermost throughout the convention. The burden of each and all was that the books and papers sent forth from our Publishing Houses might present the truth of God for these times in a strong yet appealing way, and that those who carry the literature might be more and more conscious of the sacred character of their work.

In view of the fact that restrictions are already being placed upon the circulation of the printed page in some parts of the Division, it was felt that every effort should be made now to increase greatly our colporteur force that the message may be placed in the homes of the people while yet there is opportunity.

Because of increasing indifference and antagonism to religion, it was realized that the literature evangelists should receive the most careful training in Christian salesmanship. To this end, plans were laid for the strengthening of

Publishing Work in the West Nordic Union

The publishing work in Denmark and Norway started in the year 1879, when Elder J. C. Matteson took the lead in establishing our own press in Oslo. We still have the same hand press which the brethren used in the beginning, and it still has an important part to play—namely, the pulling of proofs. We now have two linotype machines, three large printing presses, and a smaller one; two folding, two stitching, and two cutting machines, in addition to other necessary equipment.

During the year our publishing work has met with many difficulties. Especially was this true during the depression, when book sales dropped to about one-third of the average in better times. The past two or three years have shown a tendency to increase, which suggests that the economical conditions are better. The war in Ethiopia made a difference in our sales during 1936. Missionary G. Gudmundsen's book about our work in Ethiopia proved our best seller. Altogether about 32,000 copies were sold. Our literature has gone to the most out-of-theway places. One of our lady colporteurs visited Spitzbergen last summer, and among others, sold


about 200 copies of the book on. Ethiopia among the miners at that place. She is very happy over this experience, because she found souls there who were hungering after the light of truth. She has determined to make another journey to this most northerly point of the civilized world, where the inhabitants are shut up in the ice desert for five-sixths of the year.

Besides Brother Gudmundsen's book, our colporteurs have worked with the one written by Elder L. H. Christian, Facing the Future, as well as Mrs. White's Great Controversy and other smaller books. of which Uncle Arthur's Bedtime Stories are the most important. One which we always have had through the years is Steps to Christ. From three to four thousand copies of this book are sold on an average every year. All told, our colporteurs and churchmembers have sold about 200,000 copies in our small countries. We print about 15,000 copies of our health paper Sundhetsbladet every month, and from nine to ten thousand copies of our missionary paper Tidens Tale (Present Truth).

For 1937 we have prepared anew book, Et hjem—samfundetsbeste vern (The Home—the Bes—

Defence of Society) by L. Muderspach. An edition of 10,000 has been printed for Norway, and a force of faithful colporteurs have started with this, as well as others of our good books. We have already received the first encouraging reports. In addition, we are just issuing a new cookery book written by Mrs. Carla Ottosen. There has been an increased demand for practical help in vege-

tarian cooking, and we believe that this will be well received.

We look forward to the future with good courage, and are sure that the Lord God who has led in the establishing of our publishing work will guide it through all the hindrances the enemy tries to put in its way. Our colporteurs are of good courage, and work with the assurance that they are performing the commission of God.

East Danish Conference

We are never quite satisfied with the success of our work, but we often have to admit that we have had much better results than we deserved. Denmark was divided into two conferences in July, 1931. Since then the East Danish Conference has increased its membership by 236—from 1,424 to 1,660 and we arc very grateful to the Lord for this success. The tithe for the Union period, 1932-1935, shows an increase of Kr.18,310.00. The total amount was nearly half a million kroner, and this is mainly due to the fact that God's Spirit has been working upon the hearts of His people, causing them to be faithful to His instructions.

We have also felt the working of the Holy Spirit with regard to our mission offerings. The Sabbath gifts, Week of Sacrifice, Missions Extension Fund, and Harvest Ingathering all show a good increase.

As a result of our success along these lines, we have been able to

have a part in spreading the message in other countries and conferences by giving the tithe of tithe to the Division and Union, as well as mission offerings. We have also made a large contribution to the work in the West Danish Conference. We have also been able to decrease the expense of our public efforts. Formerly we began in October of one year and continued until June the following vear. Now we start in January and continue until June. We thus save a lot of expense for hall rent and advertisements. Because of this, and also the increase in tithe, we have been able to take on three new workers.

We have two church schools in our conference, with an enrolment of seventy. Four teachers are employed in these schools, which are financed by the churches.


The Danish people are not very religiously-minded. It is only now and then that we are able to gather large audiences, but on an average we get twenty-five to thirty from each effort.

At present we are having great opposition, especially from those who have left our denomination. They report us to the police for selling papers and doing Ingathering work, and distribute tracts and books against us. But we continue to work with good results, ever keeping the motto before us found in Isaiah 8:10, "God is with us." We experience this daily.

West Danish Conference

It is now just sixty years since the "Apostle of the North," John Gottlieb Matteson, returned to his native country from the United States to preach the Advent message that he had received in America as a young man. Elder Matteson found a few Sabbath-keepers near where the Danish Mission School is now situated, and from this small beginning the work in Denmark has been steadily growing.

Scattered all over the territory of the West Danish Conference are thirty-five churches and eleven or twelve smaller groups, with a total membership of 1,517 at December, 1936. Eight of these have their own houses of worship, and four have their own church schools. Only eight of the total number have a membership of over fifty. As in the work at large, there are "not many wise, not many mighty or rich men after the flesh" in our churches; but in 1936 our constituency gave Kr.91,459 in tithes, and about Kr.65,000 in offerings. We have not felt the depression in our work in Denmark so much as some other countries. During the past two years our tithes and offerings show an increase of about Kr.14,000 and Kr.4,000 respectively.

During these sixty years our colporteurs have gone all over the country scattering our literature—only God knows how much—but it must be several million kroners' worth. Out in the country you can hardly find a home where they do not have at least some Adventist literature.

The year 1936 was the best we have had in our Harvest Ingathering work, when we reached the substantial sum of Kr.29,757, or an average of twenty kroners per member, which was our goal.

The West Danish Conference has altogether twelve to fourteen workers. Six preachers and five Bible-workers are out in the field conducting public efforts, some of them in very small towns with a population from 500-2,000. Last year we baptized 100 souls, or an average of about fifteen per effort.

During the past few years several of our young people have gone to the mission fields in East and West Africa. As we pray for them, and the work in the great world field, we pray also that God will endow the workers and the churches in West Denmark with spiritual fire for the finishing of the work in our country and in our people's hearts.

THE Advent movement is faithfully marching forward in our field. We are glad that at the end of 1936 the membership had passed the 5,000 mark. This growth is not as rapid as we ourselves would like it to be, but it is consoling to observe that those who join our ranks are, as a rule, of that firm and steadfast type that are not easily turned by every wind of doctrine that blows. This is one of the characteristics of people reared in conservative countries, and it is well known that the Nordic people are among the most conservative in all Europe.

Sweden and Finland both had their spiritual revivals before the Advent message came there. The Pietistic movement from Germany had struggled hard and met to some degree with success. Methodists, Baptists, and other revival movements came on the scene, but because of certain laws enacted in 1734 to curb such movements, all these new sects suffered much persecution from ecclesiastical and civil authorities alike. Nevertheless, when God's appointed time had come, ways were opened and means ready to herald the message that was due to the people.

In Sweden especially, the fundamental tenor of the early Advent faith was being preached perhaps carlier than in most parts of the world. The child preaching of 1842 and 1843, known more or less to all the readers of the ADVENT Survey, emphasized the coming of the Lord and the judgment, even declaring that the hour of judgment was set not later than 1845. Recent investigations in this interesting awakening reveal that the movement was widespread in Sweden_ and that the bishops in some of the dioceses where the movement was the strongest, were ordered to make personal investigations and examine some of the children anc youth as to their spiritual anc mental conditions. It is remarkablthat none of the higher churc officials wholly condemned th movement. Following that reviva others more durable have come



and have made deep impressions on the religious life and thinking of the people.

While the visible results of the preaching of the Advent message at present is a membership of about 5,000, we are glad that practically all of these have become builders with us in the ministry of the kingdom of God. Their splendid co-operation is happily felt both in the local church work and in mission campaigns. Then we are told by those who know, that there are many thousands both Sweden and Finland who have attended our public meetings and are believers in the truth, but who have for several reasons not had courage to come forward and make themselves known. Even in the days of our Lord many rulers and others believed, though they did not confess Him. Perhaps a little more of the trials and persecutions that believers in other parts of the world have had to suffer will make them more daring and also ripen them for the heavenly garner.

Recently we had a conversation with a young man who attended the meetings of one of our evangelists in a town in North Sweden a few years ago. Quite a number had joined our faith in that place and a church was organized. Perhaps the evangelist felt that all who believed had come forward and joined the church. This young man confessed that he did not have the courage to take his stand, and that he is even to-day hesitant as to how he should relate himself to the truth. He also said that he knew personally of scores in the same town who felt as he did. Some try, as he does, to keep the Sabbath. A change has come into their lives. He said at last: "Surely the time will soon come when we shall dare no longer to put off the hour of decision."

All of us in the East Nordic Union have great reason for thanksgiving to God. His dealing with and through us is marvellous. The reports given at the beginning of the year of the various organizations of the Union were most

encouraging. In the conferences the number of baptisms compared very favourably with the average of several years. The tithe and mission offerings showed a substantial increase, and most of the institutions were able to report gains on the year's operating. The publishing houses both in Helsingfors and Stockholm have done well. Because of the remarkable sales of a book dealing with our missions in Abyssinia, the Stockholm house more than doubled its sales during 1936. This made it possible for the publishing house to come to the assistance of the conferences in Sweden in balancing their budgets.

Our two missionary training schools are doing good work. Both still have debts and are burdened with heavy interests on loans, so naturally it was not easy for them to show a gain. Due to careful management, however, the loss was brought down to a minimum. The attendance is growing in both schools. Interest in mission work is running high at both these important centres of Adventism in the Union. At present, large colporteur hands are doing preparatory work for the coming institutes at the close of the school year.

It is with a prayerful interest that we watch the development of the Lord's work within our borders. Soon the fruits of the winter's evangelistic efforts will be garnered in. We trust that there will be large baptisms in the many places where our evangelists are working this year.

Institute and field training and supervision.

There was a very general feeling that many more souls might be led into a full knowledge of the truth if some adequate follow-up plan could be put into operation. Much interest was shown in the plan being used in the British field in which specially interested purchasers are followed up by the Home Missionary Department through its Home Bible Study League.

Student-colporteur work came in for considerable attention, as also a variety of other subjects such as reaching the better classes, increasing the percentage of deliveries, financial relations with the colporteurs, and a host of other field and Publishing House problems too numerous to mention.

That the time spent together was most profitable to all was clearly indicated by the inspiring testimony meeting with which the convention closed. And as the recommendations are approved by the Division Committee and put into operation, we shall undoubtedly see resulting from it a mighty advance of literature evangelism in every field.

Itinerating in Sierra Leone, West Africa

THE silvery moon shone beautifully, and a gentle breeze blew in from the sea, as I wended my way through the streets of Freetown in search of our little Seventh-Day Adventist church. I inquired of an elderly man if he knew where it was. "Seventh-Day Adventist church? Do you mean Babcock's church? It is the next church on your left, sir." So our building here is known by the name of the man who built it, and who was the first to preach the message. This was the first Seventh-Day Adventist church organized in the whole of West Africa.

Though now dead, Brother Babcock still lives in the memory of those who heard him pray and preach. "He prayed us to God," said one dear old member, "and having heard him you could never forget him. He did not preach smooth things. He preached the truth, and nothing but the truth. When he preached about the Sabbath, you didn't go wondering which day to keep." This member is not alone in praying that God will again visit Freetown and revive the praying and preaching of their beloved apostle of bygone days. I had the privilege of spending a little time with our members in this city, and the meetings seemed to bring a real refreshing to them.

When visiting Sierra Leone three years ago, my visit was confined to Waterloo, the headquarters of our work here, where I met the workers at the annual meeting. This year, however, for the first time in the history of our work, it was held up-country, at Bo. Brother Wilson, who visited several of our European conferences last summer, is located at this place. A fine tabernacle of palm branches had been built, well seated, and neatly decorated. The meetings began on January 12th, and lasted five days, with a very full daily programme. On Friday night I spoke to a large assembly

in the open court in the centre of the town, and closed an inspiring meeting on Sabbath afternoon with a baptism of fourteen, the result of the work of Brother Wilson and his helpers at this place.

Brother Broberg, the superintendent of Sierra Leone, was to accompany me on a visit to our out-stations in the heathen and Mohammedan districts, but owing to a slight accident, he was advised by the doctor to return to Waterloo, and so I proceeded without him but accompanied by Pastor Nicol, a native of the country who was to be my interpreter. He is district leader of the Temne territory and a very faithful, earnest brother and worker.

Reaching our first little mission station at Yeleh, twenty-five miles from Bo by truck, Brother Nicol, my house-boy, and I made the rest of the trip on foot and cycle, through bush, along narrow paths, and by wading through streams or crossing them on logs. At the old Matamp mission station, nine miles through the bush from the motor road, where our work has been entirely closed down for some years on account of the attitude of the chief and the people in general, we had a very interesting experience.

About two years ago a young student from the Waterloo training school begged to be sent out to teach and preach, and was finally sent to this place. Now it was my great joy and privilege to find twenty well-instructed, converted fathers and mothers, and young people, ready for baptism. It was a glad day for this young teacher to see these precious souls go down into the watery grave, and rise to walk in newness of life.

The chief had built a very nice little church without cost to the mission, and this was dedicated to the service of God the same day. There is also a good school, and a fine class of new baptismal candidates there, and every prospect of

a strong work being established. Brother S. N. Wright, the young native worker, had done a great work at this place, for which both the chief and the whole village hold him in high esteem.

Thirty or forty miles more on foot and cycle brought us to Matatoka, where Pastor Nicol, the worker who faithfully watched over me day and night throughout the journey, is stationed. This is a Mohammedan stronghold, but the old chief, with a big ring in his nose, and with his forty wives and many children, has shown a kindly interest in our school work, and has built us a real good church building without cost to the mission. It was packed full at the meeting, and many stood outside, listening to the message. Twelve were baptized at this place.

Time did not permit me to visit our Mende stations, but all the workers were present at the annual meeting. The field has in all, twenty-six native workers, pastors, teachers, and evangelists, with some newly-added probation workers. There are thirteen out-schools, with an enrolment of 678 pupils; 332 baptized churchmembers, 181 in baptismal classes, twenty-nine S a b b a t h-s c h o o l s, and 1,494 Sabbath-school nuembers.

The training school at Waterloo, which educates the pupils up to standards nine and ten, has the reputation of being a very good one. They have a good staff of teachers. Brother H. Rasmussen, who is now on furlough, has done much toward raising the standard of the school, and we should in the very near future be getting a much larger number of welltrained, consecrated evangelists and teachers from it. There is also a very great need for a girls' school in Sierra Leone. Brother Broberg is giving himself entirely to the task of building up the work. and has the confidence and cooperation of all his fellow-workers.

Conference in Latvia

We have been waiting a long time for permission from the Latvian government to hold our annual conference, and this was granted for March 5th to 8th. The government has taken away from us the church rights which we had before and requested that all churches be re-registered-none with less than fifty members-that their leaders be appointed for a period of three years, and that their budgets be submitted for approval. When this was done the ten churches had the right to work out a conference constitution and come together. Two delegates from every church were appointed to approve the constitution, to choose five men to arrange for the registration of the constitution, and to call the conference to elect new officers for three years.

On March 5th eighty-five delegates came together to do the business of the conference. There were about 500 believers present in our church in Riga when it took place. The Minister of Religious Cults attended the first meeting and gave a good speech lasting about twenty minutes. He said that the Latvian government would protect all religious bodies in Latvia and give them freedom to worship. After his speech, the conference president's report was read and also the financial reports of the conference, the publishing house, and the legal association. The amount of money given by the believers for the work in Latvia seemed to stir the government minister and he rose to speak. He said that from now on the government would regulate the money used for church activities, and would see to it that the members were not pressed hard for money, and that they should no longer pay tithes to support the work. Here he met with an unexpected protest from the whole house. All our people said loudly that they were going to pay their tithe, and that no one could stop them from doing that, as it was their duty to God. This protest was a great testimony

to the faithfulness of our people in Latvia.

The business of the conference was very heavy, as there were many new things to be regulated in conformity with the new law. It required that five men be chosen by the conference as leaders for the next three years, and Brethren Oltin, Klotin, Jurkevics, Krievs, and Willson were elected. These men have the right to choose from among their number the president, secretary, treasurer, and other needed officers. Brother Brutan was elected as director of our missionary school, Brother Eglit as Bible-teacher, and Brother Klotin as editor of our papers.

The conference was a very interesting one. No foreigners took part in any meetings or discussions, but the Latvian brethren took hold of the situation very well. God blessed them in the work. The men chosen have the confidence of all the people and we wish them much of the blessing of God. Brethren, remember Latvia in your prayers.

Notes from the Secretary

The month of May sees the beginning of our annual conference meetings in the Northern European Division. The Division staff will be scattered during the next few weeks, attending meetings in all parts of the Division including far Iceland in the North Atlantic, North Norway above the Arctic Circle, South Poland on the borders of Czechoslovakia, and the other fields between. Let us pray that God will visit His people as they gather to seek His face during the coming weeks.

We are glad to report that C. L. Bond, Associate Secretary of the Missionary Volunteer Department of the General Conference, will be visiting the Northern European Division during the next few weeks, and will attend as many of the annual meetings as possible. We welcome Elder Bond to our

Division and trust his ministry will be a great blessing to our people. Because of conflicting dates, it will not be possible for Elder Bond to attend all the annual meetings in the Division.

THE year is quickly passing. Four months have gone. It may be well to check up and see if plans are maturing to put the recommendations passed at the Skodsborg meeting into effect. For example, how is the debt reduction plan working in your field? "churches encumbered with debt making every sacrifice and effort possible to free themselves from the burden of debt as rapidly as they are able"? This was a part of the recommendation on debt reduction and we hope it is receiving the attention it deserves. It would be well to read the whole recommendation again and put forth every effort to carry it out as fully as possible during 1937.

THE Week of Sacrifice comes this year during the month of May. Surely the times demand real sacrifice on the part of every worker. We are living on the verge of the eternal world. Doors now open may soon close. Let us as workers each make this a sacrificial week in rededicating our lives in service and in bringing an offering to the Lord that will be commensurate with the great need.

ALL our fields have now been operating for four months under the 1937 budget. What has this period revealed? If the rest of the year continues as the first four months, will there be a deficit or a gain on December 31st? Now is the time to check up and if need be, readjust our work so that every field may be assured of closing the year without a loss.

This is a good time also to check up on our per capita mission offerings. It will be remembered that at the Skodsborg Council, per capita goals were fixed for every field in the Division. We have not received the first quarter's summaries yet, but hope they will reveal a good advance in mission offerings throughout the Division.

Northern European Division of the General Conference of Seventh-Day Adventists

Containing Statistical, Financial, and Institutional Reports for the Year Ended December 31, 1936

The Annual Reports

WE herewith present the complete annual reports of the various activities of the Northern European Division for the year ending December 31, 1936. We are glad to note that in almost every department of our work a good advance is recorded. These cold figures represent days and weeks of faithful service on the part of our 559 evangelistic workers, 322 colporteurs, 323 teachers, 790 workers in our medical institutions, and 106 publishing house employees. Eternity alone will reveal the full fruitage of these 2,100 workers.

These reports also indicate that associated with the workers we have a faithful constituency of 34,249 believers in the Advent message who are giving their wholehearted support to the cause of God. A total of \$310,373.40 was paid in tithe during 1936 and \$209,-700.57 in mission offerings. The total of \$520,073.97 represents an average of \$15.18 for every believer in the Division, both at home and in the mission fields. In addition to these generous gifts we are glad to note that the missionary activity of our laymen won 331 souls to the truth during 1936. Many other lines of missionary work are also reported, and we believe that the seed sown will yet bear fruit unto life eternal.

Our Sabbath-school membership now stands at 55,693, which is an increase of 5,000 above the 1935 total. In offerings our Sabbathschool members gave \$68,198.15, or an average of 3.8 cents per week per churchmember for the Division.

A study of our church member-

ship totals reveals some interesting facts. The total net increase for 1936 was 1,505, or five per cent over the 1935 figure. The largest increase in membership was in the mission fields, being thirteen per cent over the previous year, while in the home fields we had only a two per cent increase, the lowest ever recorded since the organization of the Division. We trust that during 1937 our home Unions will make a better showing in soul-saving, for surely that is the real object of our work.

We take this opportunity of ex-

pressing our hearty thanks to all our fellow-workers and to our brethren and sisters who have laboured so faithfully during the past year. We have appreciated your whole-hearted co-operation and your willing service. We are living in troublous times. No one can tell how long these days of comparative peace will be ours. Let us reconsecrate our all to the Master for the finishing of the work of God in the Northern European Division before doors now open shall be closed for ever.
